Voices Concern Over

Narrow Specialization

A contributing cause to many business failures has been too narrow specialization on the part of top management, says Senator Donald Cameron, director of the University of Alberta's department of extension and head of the Banff school of advanced management.

Emphasis today, as the basis for top executive training, he adds, is on a broad, general education with special training in the social sciences—particularly history, economics, psychology and literature, and it is no accident that 40 per cent of most management training programs are in the field of human relations.

Senator Cameron outlined his views in an address to this week's annual meeting at Jasper, Alta. of the Canadian Gas Association.

PROMOTIONS RAPID
The Banff school of advanced management has resulted from an appeal in 1951 to the University of Alberta by the oil industry which was expanding so rapidly that it was practically impossible to man its offices with reasonably trained management personnel.

The universities of British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Manitoba were invited to join in and the first school was put on in 1952. Since then, 368 Canadian executives have participated in a highly-concentrated program of a half-dozen six-week schools.

Under the lectureship program the Banff school will bring to western Canada yearly a leading lecturer from "anywhere in the world."

He will lecture at both the fall and winter advanced management programs at Banff; will be made available to the four western universities for special lectures to all students; and will also be available for a limited number of public lectures to such organizations as chambers of commerce and Canadian clubs.

Europe Offering Bargain Vacations For Englishmen

Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP) — A beaming waiter brings another cup of coffee topped with whipped cream. A strolling violinist serenades the ladies of the party as they relax at their open-air tables and watch the sunset over the Alps before retiring to their first-class hotel accommodation.

The average Englishman can have two weeks of this kind of vacation for less than \$100—all expenses paid.

With a vast selection of travel agencies arranging low-budget vacations, he can explore almost every corner of Europe and remain untroubled by language barriers. Bilingual couriers generally accompany all English-speaking groups.

A 14-day trip to the mountain resort of Strobl, Austria, can be enjoyed for £35 (\$98). The cost covers the return flight from London to Munich, and a four-hour bus-ride to the first-class hotel on the edge of the Wolfgang Lake.
