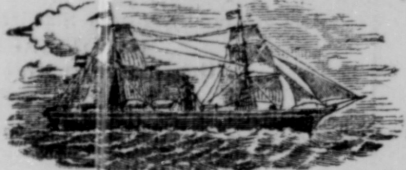

Local and Other Items.

STRIKE AGAINST CHINESE.—Nearly all the bricklayers employed in Vancouver have gone on strike as a protest against the employment by contractors of Chinese labor.

THE CANADA LIFE.—The Canada Life Assurance Company proposes to move its headquarters from Hamilton to Toronto within the next month, and preparations are now being made for the removal.

HOMEWARD BOUND.—General Otis, on Friday, notified the U. S. War Department of the sailing of the transport Sherman with 1,287 officers and men of the California Regiment, and 256 discharged soldiers. Total passengers, 1,567.

PENNY SAVINGS.—The Chicago Penny-Saving Society, operating through the public school teachers, last year received from the children of that city over seventy thousand dollars. This means that at least forty thousand dollars less a year is being spent for candy and chewing gum, and that over four thousand children are becoming capitalists at the rate of five cents a day.

FIREMEN'S AUTOMOBILE.—The first electric cart of the firemen of Paris is now running on the streets and has already begun its work of saving life and property. It is a handsome vehicle, with a seat in front for several firemen, and a horizontal steering wheel. Back of this is a "dos-a-dos" arrangement which will permit of seating several firemen. Between these seats is a box for noes. The batteries are carried underneath, and scaling ladders are carried at the side.

SODA WATER.—After September 1, the syrups used in soda water in New York will be subjected to the careful scrutiny of the Health Department, and not only will the small vendors who peddle from their carts come under the jurisdiction of the department, but the large drugstores which dispense soda water from pretentious fountains will also be under their supervision. The act is aimed particularly at imitations of lemon and orange juices which are very injurious. Imitation pineapple made from others is also unwholesome. The selling of adulterated syrups is now a misdemeanor in the State and is punishable by fine or imprisonment.

THE DRY GOODS REVIEW.—We have received a copy of the July number of the Dry Goods Review. It is called the Fall number. Its special feature is an article on "Canada from Ocean to Ocean" which is profusely illustrated in colors; in fact the whole number is splendidly printed and illustrated. One of the illustrations, not as good as it might be, in connection with this article, is of our own Queen Square, and of the Island it says "Crossing to Prince Edward Island, this charming little province with its fine cultivated areas and pretty scenery, the traveller finds that trade and industry go hand in hand with a quite enjoyment of life."

ESTEEMED EXCHANGES

Montreal Star: "What Sir Wilfrid could not justify, and promised to reduce by several millions, was "the extraordinary expenditure" of \$42,371,000 for all purposes. His own Government has already asked for nearly \$52,000,000, besides the railway subsidies, etc., now proposed and the supplementary estimate, for 1898-99 voted early this session making a total of \$60,916,214.06 asked for this session. Does he imagine there is any justification for this extraordinary expenditure?"

An American Claim.

WASHINGTON, July 29.—R. Brown, who claims to be a citizen of the United States, has filed with the State Department a claim for \$2,000,000 against the Transvaal. He alleges that he had mining interests in that country which he lost because justice was denied him in the courts. He asserts that the court was originally favourable to him, but that Kruger removed the Chief Justice because of a disposition to favour him. The matter will be investigated.

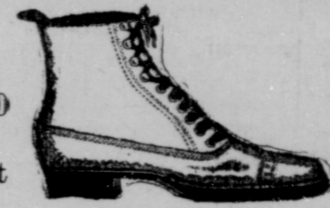
