Geologist Addresses SDU Students

K.F. Neale, lecturer in geological engineering at Nova Scotia Technical College, visited St. Dunstan's University yesterday to address the engineering students on the opportunities available in the field of mineral engineering. Mr. Neale said that Tech grants three degrees that come under the heading of mineral engineering. They are mining, geological and metallurgical engineering degrees. He said that the work of such engineers deals mainly with organization and development, and with techniques and plans regarding the economic feasibility of exporting a "find." Mr. Neale pointed out that there is a great scarcity of such engineers, that there are many opportunities for employment, and that such engineers enjoy the highest starting salaries in the engineering field. A native of South Africa, Mr. Neale has done post-graduate work in Imperial College, London, England, and worked for four years as a prospector in Tanganyika before coming to Canada last year.

Measuring 40 by 100 with attractive angle stone front and large display windows, the store contains two check out counters, a self service produce case, frozen food and meat cases, a dairy case and a service meat case. There are three 50-foot gondolas, self service dry goods, household wares and hardware areas. The interior has full length fluorescent lighting, tile floors, acoustic ceiling tile and decorative hanging lamps. Interior colors are sunfrost yellow, blue azure and blossom. The building was constructed with local labor under the direction of John Perry, Tignish.
