

Are You Doing Any Real Work.

The following taken from the Y. M. C. A. News Bulletin, of Steubenville, Ohio, will bear reading by every member of the Association:

"Young man are you doing any work for Jesus? Think before you answer. Is just going to church twice every Sabbath working for Christ? Is attending Sunday School regularly and listening to a teacher who has faithfully prepared the lesson doing work for Christ? Is taking a walk every Sunday afternoon because you have worked so hard in church and Sunday School and are tired out, what is meant by 'Son' go work to-day in my vineyard? Does the devil take a vacation during the summer so that you can give up active work when it is 'too hot'? Do you think, when you come to render an account of your stewardship, that the Master will say, 'Well done, good and faithful servant?' Dear brother, enter your closet, and on your knees prayerfully ask yourself if you are doing the work your Heavenly Father has given you to do. The young Men's Christian Association presents a field for work which every Christian young man should enter. Young men for young is the work, and all for Christ. There is room for a large number of workers in every Association. Come with us, and we will do you good.

"As you contemplate the fact that there are several thousand young men who are apparently outside the influence of the church and religion, does it not stir you, fellow reader, with a desire to enlist in the work to rescue and win them to the Lord. It is the grandest, noblest and most God-like work that ever engaged the energies of man.

"It is sometimes said against Y. M. C. A. work that it is not self-sustaining. Some one has to contribute to its support all the time. 'But one must remember that the work of the Association is chiefly a labor of love. The Association does not traffic in men's souls it seeks no profit from its labor save that of a consciousness of duty well performed and the joy of being a co-worker with God in the salvation of men's souls. It costs money to carry on work which endeavors to turn the eyes of men heavenward, and enable them to walk in that celestial road, but it costs infinitely more to ruin, degrade and destroy, not only their bodies, but their everlasting souls. Compare the amount of money which is spent to lure men to destruction with the money and labor spent to enable men to live Christian and happy lives. We may not see the profit in dollars and cents, but we do see it in the Christian character young men, under such influences as these, are forming."

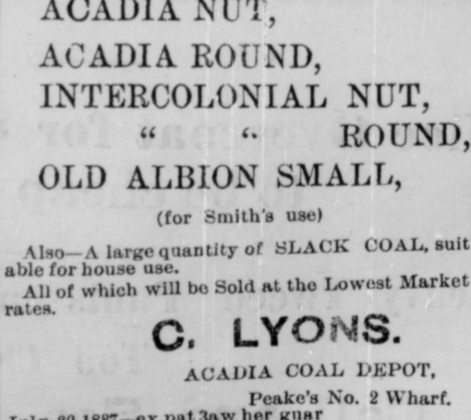
