THE REVISED TARIFF.

JUDGING by the points set forth in THE EXAMINER'S telegraphic despatches, the tariff, as revised and now in operation throughout Canada, will afford all the relief to taxpayers that our revenue requirements will admit of, and at the same time continue to home industries a decided advantage in the home market.

The fact that the papers which lean towards the manufacturing interests have already raised the cry, "a farmers' tariff" may be taken as evidence that the revision is decidedly favorable to our agriculturists. We have no doubt that other interests have had continued to them all the advantages that the present conditions of trade will justify.

MARITIME RECIPROCITY.
