

42 Scholarships Offered To Essay Contest Winners

Predicting what the next quarter-century holds for them and for Canada will win scholarship awards for 42 Canadian High School and University students who attain top ranking in a nationwide essay competition announced recently by the New York Life Insurance Company.

Entrants will be required to write "My Career in Canada During the Next 25 Years."

Fred A. Wade, C. L. U., Toronto, field vice-president in charge of the Company's Canadian operations, described the project as part of the Company's Centennial Year observance in Canada.

Mr. Wade said that 30 awards would be made at the High School level, with first, second and third prizes of respectively \$350, \$200, and \$100 being distributed in each of ten geographical regions, with additional recognition to be given the national winner.

At the University level eleven awards of \$500 each will be made in the four regions into which Canada has been divided in terms of University enrollment. An additional \$500 will go to the

national winner, Mr. Wade said. Leading figures in Canadian education, business and the arts make up the panels of judges for the competition. A. E. Grauer, president of the British Columbia Power Corporation and a member of the Gordon Commission, is chairman of the University national panel. Chairman of the High School panel is Arthur McNamara, former deputy-minister of Labor in the federal civil service.

Other members of the national judging panels include Dr. Watson Kirkconnell, president of Acadia University, and Senator Muriel Ferguson of Fredericton and Ottawa.

Commenting on the projected essay contest, Dr. L. W. Shaw, provincial deputy-minister and director of Education, said that the contest should prove "a worthwhile incentive", while noting that its effectiveness here would be "limited", since this Province had been grouped for three purposes with the other Provinces in the Atlantic Region.

Will Honor Welsh Bard

PONTYPRIDD, South Wales—A committee of Welsh people has been formed in this town with the object of renovating the hillside graveyard and restoring the grave of Evan James, who in 1856 wrote the Welsh national anthem "Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau". It is hoped that this effort will be supported by Welsh people all over the world. The sum aimed at is £5,000.

In 1956 a fine monument was erected in the park at Pontypridd, by the Welsh people in Wales and other countries, to Evan James and his son James James, the latter having helped in the composition of the Welsh national anthem. The memorial to the composers is in the form of two statues by the eminent Welsh sculptor, Sir W. Goscombe John, R.A. One is a male figure typifying music, and the other is a female figure typifying poetry. Contributions will be received and acknowledged by Sir Robert Webber, care of the Western Mail, Cardiff, South Wales.
