

At Albuquerque, N. M., special from Chihuahua, Mexico, states that a recent massacre in Casa Grande by Indians proves to have been a horrible affair. A band of Apaches, numbering five hundred, crossed the border, descended upon the little town and began an indiscriminate massacre. Fully seventy-five persons were victims. Several girls and women were carried off by the savages and a large quantity of stock and other property stolen. The houses of the unfortunate Mexicans were burned and dead bodies were stripped of their clothing and jewelry. The murdered persons were among the wealthiest class, several of the most prominent families being among the victims. Troops were dispatched to the scene but the capture of the Indians is not probable.

Never since the first settlement of Indiana has there been a larger crop of hickory, oak, and beech than that of the present season. The nuts are now falling, and hogs that are running loose in the woods will soon be very fat. Farmers say that three weeks' feeding of corn after the hogs have become fat on mast will make the meat as hard and firm as if it had been fed on corn exclusively.

Arrangements have been made by the Minister of Militia for a course of lectures and practical instructions in field fortification, military engineering, etc., at the Royal Military College, Kingston, for the benefit of officers attending the Royal Schools of Gunnery at Kingston and Quebec, for courses of instruction.

The London Daily News' Rangoon correspondent reports that the eldest son of the late King of Burmah escaped from Benares. It is believed he is en route to the Upper Burmah to raise rebellion.
