Campbell Calls Lindsay 'An Amazing Athlete'

MONTREAL (CP) — NHL President Clarence Campbell, who threatened last month to toss Ted Lindsay out of the league, lauded the Detroit Red Wing veteran Thursday as "an amazing athlete."

In an unusual press release from National Hockey League headquarters, Campbell said this season's comeback by the 40-year-old Lindsay ranks as "one of the most amazing feats in professional sport."

"I know I was among the many knowledgeable hockey people who expressed skepticism when it was first announced that Lindsay would try a comeback after being away from the game for four years. But now I know I was wrong. The words of praise had a far different sound to those exchanged between Campbell and the Red Wing leftwinger early in January."

Lindsay, at that time, set off a brief, but heated, controversy by refusing to pay \$75 in fines assessed him following some post-game comments on the officiating in a Detroit-Toronto contest. The fiery veteran then termed Campbell's office a "kangaroo court" and said the league would have to take him to court to collect the money.

Campbell, deeming the comments a direct challenge to his authority and integrity, announced Jan. 6 that Lindsay had been suspended indefinitely. Within two hours, however, the suspension was lifted after the player signed a Campbell-drafted letter apologizing for his conduct and publicly acknowledging the NHL president's authority and "complete integrity."

Campbell admitted that, prior to the season, he thought a comeback attempt by a player of Lindsay's age, especially after four years on the sidelines, would reflect on the general calibre of NHL play and have a "demoralizing effect" on Detroit team spirit.

Lindsay, however, has completely reversed the situation by his play. Instead of the young players taking the attitude that Lindsay was in a game in which he no longer belonged, they are looking to him for his leadership qualities.

"And those qualities have emerged strongly as a result of his play. He has to be rated as an amazing athlete."
