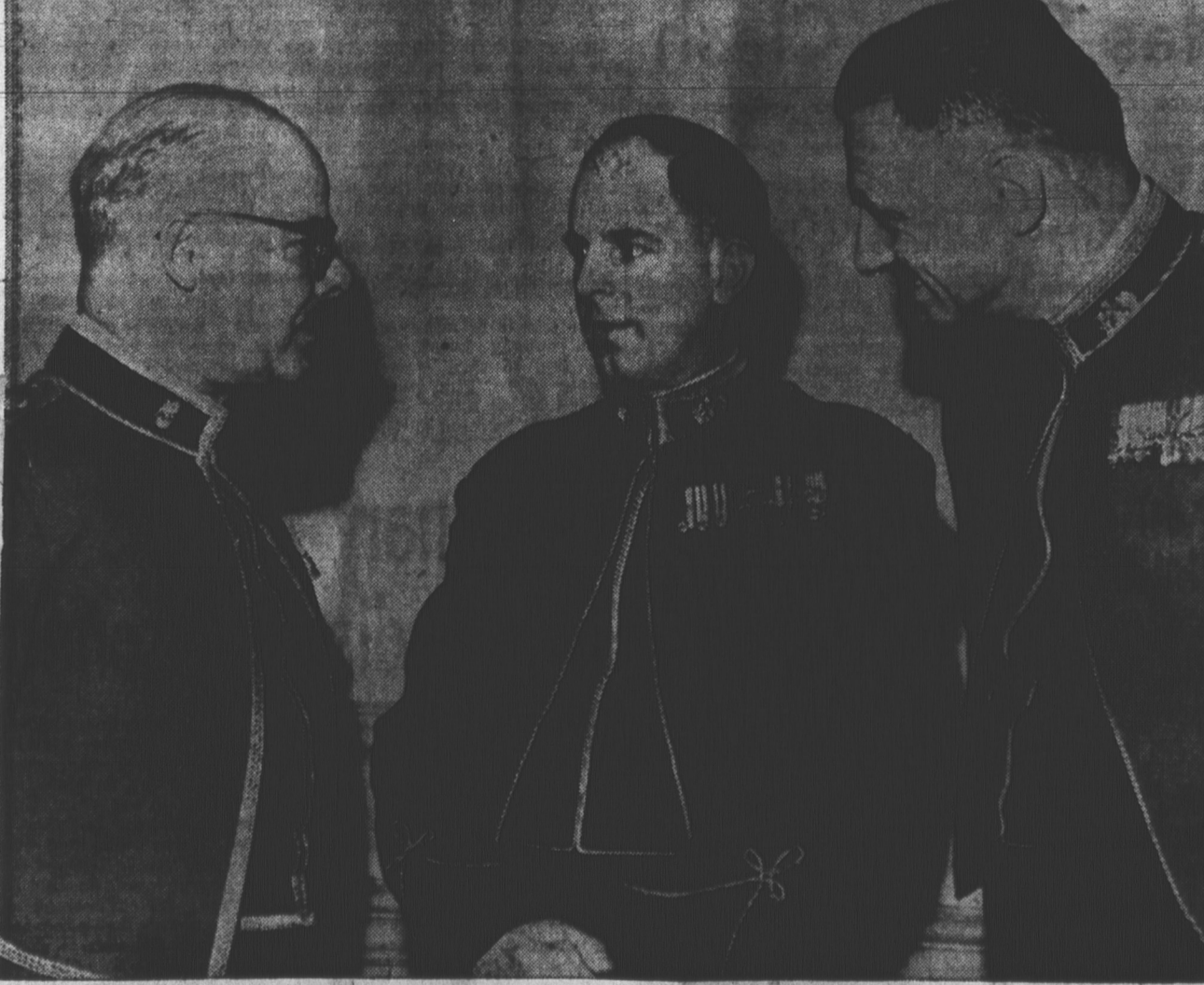
### Potato Producers Plan Disease Check Effort
