GREAT BRITAIN AND HER GOLD REGIONS.

(New York Evening Post.)

These gold fields are in British territory. The Klondike branches from the Yukon near the Alaskan boundary, and the gold has been discovered mainly along its course in the North West Territory. Yet the successful miner, the men who come home with tales of fabulous wealth attained in a few weeks, are largely American citizens. That is to say they are "aliens," "foreign devils," allowed to go freely into British territory and carry away its chief treasure without let or hindrance. Imagine the case reversed. Imagine the gold fields on our side of the Alaskan border, and Englishmen swarming in to despoil us. What shrieks to high heaven and appeals to Congress there would be! We should have laws in a twinkling to make all alien miners pay nine-tenths of their findings into our treasury. We should tax them heavily to get into the territory, and not let them get out without paying the uttermost farthing. What some of our states have done in the way of legislation to make aliens smart for lending us capital and developing our resources fairly indicates what we would do in the case supposed. This stupid English indifference to the nationality of the man extracting wealth from English soil would never be the policy of a wide awake and paternal and strictly look-out-for-number one American government.

The incident throws light on the terrible "land-grabbing" propensity of England. She grabs everywhere, but she throws what she grabs open to all the world. She is well known to grab with peculiar fury when it is a question of getting a bit of gold-bearing land; that always drive her frantic. But, as the Klondike gold finds show, she lets foreigners come and help themselves to the gold after she has grabbed it. She polices the territory acquired; she establishes courts; she fosters education and religion; but she gives Frenchmen, Germans, Italian, or even her dearest foes, Americans, the same rights there as Englishmen. This is a policy of incredible silliness, according to American standards. It might be justified on the theory that law and international policy are intended to promote trade and industry, and make human liberty and happiness as secure as possible; but we know that theory to be entirely mistaken. Laws exist for the purpose of discriminating against foreigners, and causing misers in foreign cities, as McKinley boasted that his tariff had done. International relations are to be so managed that every nation's hand will be against its fellow. This being the American conception, the obsolescence, the isolation, the supreme folly of the English policy are clearly proved—and that, of course, is the main thing.

THE HEADSMAN AT SPRINGHILL

The latest excitement at Springhill is the popular local indignation over the ruthless way that the political axe is falling in the country. One of the four dismissed men at the junction has been a faithful government employe for twenty-five years at that place and now finds himself turned out without any reason being assigned. The dismissal of hard working men, and the turning out of their families has occasioned much revulsion of feeling among the workmen. The Observer (Ind) says: "It is a shame and it is not likely that it will bring any grist to the mill of those responsible for this inhuman act. There is no man in Springhill who would be mean enough to take the bread from another man's mouth." The News and Advertiser slashes at the outrage in the following terse language: "Every vestige of true manliness and honor is lost in such base transaction, and none but craven corruptionists and black-legs would demean their manhood by seeking and filling the snarched places of honest laboring men, whose bread has been so brutally snatched from their mouths and from their children. It is a miserably mean business and it should make the perpetrators hang their heads with shame. A humanity that can sink to the depths and degradation of taking the bread from sons of toil needs the sharp lesson of having its own sources of revenue dammed up. Ours is the cruel crew that glory is such vanal aim and oppression.
