Increase Shown In Lobster Cases Heard Last Year

HALIFAX (CP) - Nova Scotia led the Maritimes last year in the number of prosecutions for violations of lobster fishing regulations.

Percentage-wise Nova Scotia was the lowest in lobstering prosecutions. There are 12,000 lobster fishermen in that province.

In 1957 Nova Scotia's four fisheries districts recorded 431 prosecutions for all fisheries violations.

Fisheries prosecutions in the whole Maritime area totalled 744 last year, compared with 718 the previous year.

Statistics were included in a report at the annual meeting of the Federal Fisheries Department's Maritime area.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The tiny U.S. vanguard satellite may stay aloft more than 2,000 years - 10 times longer than forecast earlier.

Rear-Admiral John T. Hayward, the navy's research chief, gave this prediction to the House of Representatives space committee.

Hayward described the 94-pound vanguard as "the only U.S. object in space that is still faithfully doing the job it was designed for."

WINNIPEG (CP) - D. E. Kilgour of Winnipeg was elected president of the Great-West Life Assurance Company at the firm's annual meeting.

The 22-year-old editor was permanently suspended by the student's judicial committee Monday for an article that appeared Jan. 30 in the weekly Acadia Athenaeum.

The staffers signed a petition to resign "until such time as the decision of the student judicial committee is revoked and the original editor-in-chief is returned to office."

Dr. Kirkpatrick branded the article as "foul blasphemy" and infringement on religious conscience.
