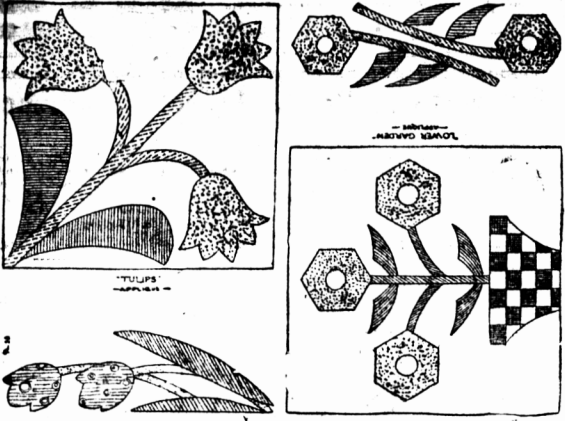

THE COOK'S CORNER

DATE STICKS

Two eggs, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup dates, cut, 1 cup nuts, chopped, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

DATE CORNSTARCH PUDDING One-quarter milk, 1 tablespoon butter, 3 tablespoons sugar, 4 tablespoons cornstarch, 1/2 pound dates, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract, 1/2 teaspoon almond extract.

MOCK TORINI DESSERT One pound dates, cut fine, 1/2 pound marshmallows, cut, 1 dozen macaroons, crumbled, 1/2 cup walnut meats, cut, 1 cup whipped cream, 1/2 cup white grape juice.

CRUMBLY DATE TORTE Two eggs, 1/2 cup sugar, 4 tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 cup dates, cut, 1 cup pecans, cut, few grains salt.

HONEY DATE BARS Three eggs, 1 cup strained honey, 1 cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 pound dates, cut, 1 cup whole nut meats.

Don't Pick a Husband Simply for His Looks; Question His Ability as a Good Provider; Also the "Good-Looker" Frequently Will Give You More Cause for Jealousy
