London Has New Newspaper

LONDON, (CP)—The Recorder, London's first new daily newspaper in more than 20 years, hits the streets today with a circulation target of 100,000 copies.

Heading the morning daily and its parent, The Recorder Weekly, is 48-year-old William J. Brittain, at one time on the editorial staffs of the Montreal Star and the Toronto Star. Brittain owns 75 per cent of the publishing company, The Recorder Ltd., which has capital of \$125,000 in ordinary shares with a loan of \$25,000.

The Recorder will sell in London and the home counties at two pence. Brittain says he hopes later to expand its circulation areas to the provinces.

Owens 12 Papers
Brittain purchased The Recorder then a weekly with a circulation of 700, in 1935 and has planned the launching of a London daily for almost 20 years. Recent relaxation of newspaper restrictions has finally made it possible. He now owns 12 newspapers and journals, five of them local London papers and the rest international journals and trade magazines.

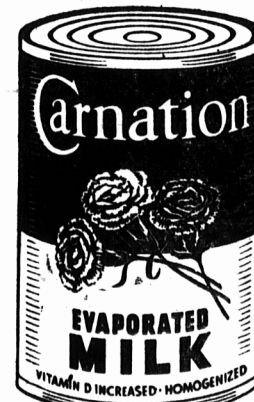


