For the slaying of his wife in Quebec air disaster which killed 23 others, J. Albert Guay will be hanged June 23, exactly one year after he threatened "Angel Mary" with gun.

Unavailable for comment was Marie Ange Robitaille, 19-year-old Quebec waitress. Guay's love for her was one of motives for slaying of his wife in time-bomb plot.

Quickest verdict on record in Canadian murder cases — 17 minutes — was returned by the 12-man French-speaking jury. Mrs. Guay had right to live, said judge.

Weeping as he finished his charge, Judge Albert Sevigny, shown, later praised the jury for a "good verdict." Hanging his head, Guay, told judge: "I have nothing to say."



Half-million and million-dollar fires occurred overnight in Ottawa and London, Ont. Nineteen were made homeless in the capital, where blaze gutted three-storey store, left, "Toughest fire in years," said firemen.

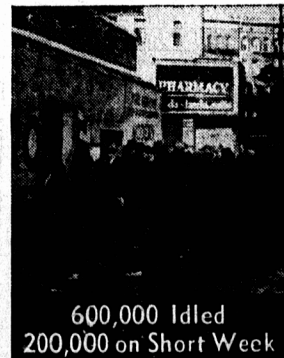

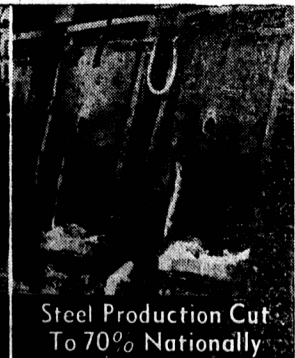

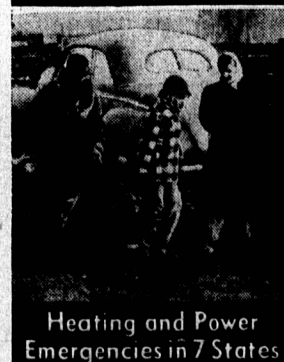
