TURN ABOUT IS FAIR PLAY

It is part of the folk-lore of most peoples that loaning money to a friend often results in the loss of both money and friend. Nor is borrowing any wiser. Shakespeare sums it up in his flawless way:

"Neither a borrower nor a lender be:
For loan oft loses both itself and friend
And borrowing dulls the edge of husbandry."

But Shakespeare and all others through the ages who expressed this idea, referred only to the chronic borrower, or the chronic lender. It is spine-chilling to consider a world where friends and neighbors, near or distant, would hesitate in time of need to be either borrowers or lenders!

Without a doubt, satisfactory relationships between individuals or groups can only be built on a give and take basis. As the saying goes, "Turn about is fair play." Indeed it is the only way to play and have fun!

These thoughts came to me while reading an article by Richard L. Neuberger in a recent issue of the American weekly, "The Reporter." It is called, "Canada's Social Security System for Children" and stressed the need of the United States for a similar system. The writer states, "If family allowances eventually are adopted in the United States, they probably will resemble in substantial measure the program that has been in effect in Canada since the year, 1945."

It is good that the United States should look to Canada in such an important matter as family allowances. Because in the past Canada was smaller and weaker, she probably had on occasion to borrow ideas and skills from her richer neighbour.

Many Islanders who have not been directly affected by the family allowance law may be rather vague about it. It may not be amiss to discuss it briefly as outlined in the article referred to.
