OTAWA (CP)

The CBC, which received about 80 per cent of its revenues from the public treasury, spent more in the 1954-55 fiscal year than it received in general grants and allocation of taxes.

COMMERCIAL INCOME

Income of \$6,263,190 from commercial broadcasting and smaller amounts from other sources, such as broadcasting licence fees, gave the CBC total revenues of \$34,735,788.

DOWN 35 PER CENT

The last fiscal year's net surplus of \$4,267,668 was down about 35 per cent from the \$6,577,822 surplus of 1953-54. The drop was mainly to reduced income and increased spending for radio broadcasting and television expenditures.

WINNIPEG (CP)—Flax trade was quite active on the Winnipeg grain exchange Wednesday. There was good commercial demand, mostly in shipping and export purchases.

NET SURPLUS

The television service, the report said, received \$16,959,965 from the excise tax on TV sets and parts, bringing its total income to \$21,757,895.

SCIENTIFIC RATES

Depreciation costs were \$1,364,533, based on what the CBC's financial report described as scientific rates varying between five and 20 per cent, depending on the type of assets.
