

# A Paradise For Fishermen

Prince Edward Island is dotted with flourishing towns and villages, which appeal to the summer visitor and offer attractions not afforded by the larger centres, notably in the way of fishing.

Georgetown, capital of King's County, is famed for its magnificent harbour and boating and sea fishing facilities.

Souris, charmingly situated on high ground with a fine view of the open sea, is an angler's paradise. Souris River, Souris beach, Rollo Bay, Bay Fortune, North Lake, East Lake, Black Pond and Big Point—all excellent trout fishing places—are within easy reach.

Montague, thriving and up-to-date as a municipality, also is within short reach of good trout fishing at Montague River, Sturgeon River, Brudenell and numerous mill streams.

Another noted fishing resort is Murray River, situated on the Murray Harbor branch of the Canadian National Railways.

At the western end of the province are two centres well and favorably known to tourists—Alberton, situated on the head waters of Casumpec Bay, and Tignish, the western terminus of the C. N. R. Both are in the vicinity of good fishing streams.

Indeed, there is scarcely any part of the Island Province where the disciple of Isaac Walton cannot make himself happy for however long he cares to sojourn during the season.



# P.E.I. National Park

Latest addition to Canada's system of national playgrounds, the Prince Edward Island National Park extends along the northern shore for a distance of about twenty-five miles between New London Harbour and Tracadie Harbour. The area is approximately seven and a half square miles. It contains the finest beaches in America with a background of rolling sand dunes or picturesque red sandstone headlands which the action of the sea has worn into curious formations. The main beaches within the park are those located near Cavendish, Brackley and Stanhope.

South of the beaches and sandhills of the Cavendish area is Green Gables Farm, made famous by Lucy Maud Montgomery's novel "Anne of Green Gables." The entire farm has been developed as a luxurious 18-hole golf course which will be formally opened by Hon. T. A. Crerar on July 16. Many of the places mentioned in the novel, the "Lake of Shining Waters," "Lover's Lane," the "Haunted Wood" and "Dryad's Bubble" are featured in the course and all are made accessible by a system of walks and bridle paths.

There are numerous trout fishing streams in the Park and at Rustico Harbour, Covehead Bay and Tracadie Harbour deep sea fishing parties can be organized. The Park is readily accessible by several motor roads and at Rustico by paved highways from Brudenell, Summerside and Charlottetown.

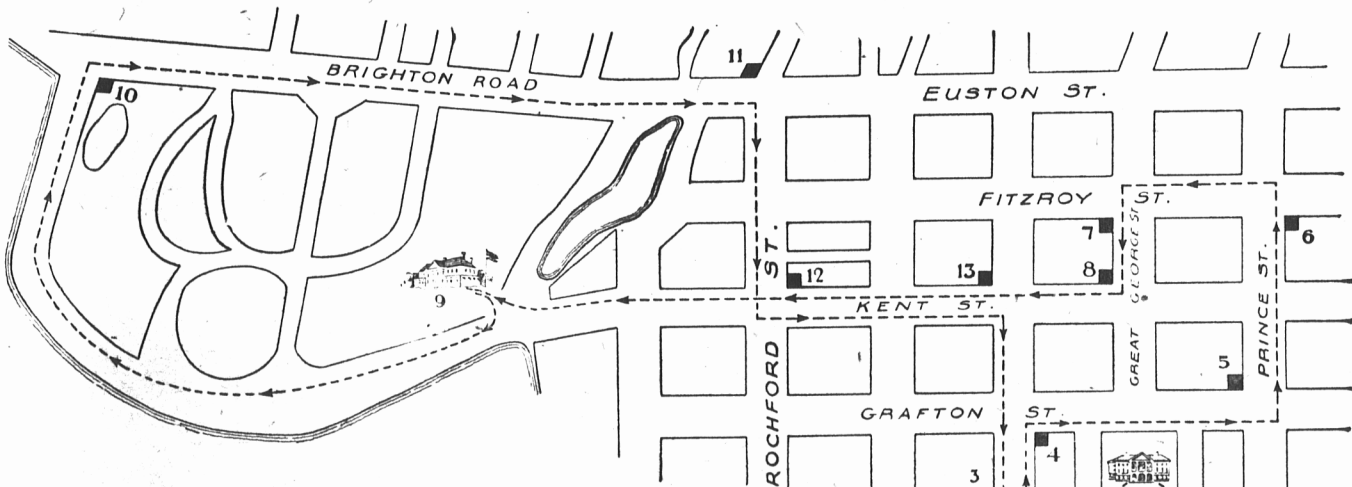

CARS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED — 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. — Between Prince and Queen Streets from Water to Euston; between Hillsboro and West Streets from Grafton to Euston; Victoria Park Driveway from Government House to Brighton Road.

NO PARKING ALLOWED — 11 p.m. of the 13th to 1 a.m. of the 15th — North River Road from Brighton Road to Sanatoucton, Elm Avenue from Euston Street to Gerald Street, Longworth Avenue between Railway Crossing and Euston Street.

ONE WAY STREETS — 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. — Euston Street from Longworth Ave to Brighton Shore — west-bound traffic only — (no parking). Weymouth Street from Richmond to Euston — north-bound traffic only — (no parking).

PARKING — Cars may be parked in Victoria Park, under supervision. Remain until 5 p.m. Parties coming off Hillsborough Bridge MAY park on the Rifle Range on the right of the C.N.R. Fill on the left. No parked cars may be moved until after 5 p.m., except from Rifle Range and C.N.R.

SCHOOL CHILDREN — Cars from West of Charlottetown travel Elm Ave. to Alley Street. Turn left on Alley to Prince. Left on Prince to Prince Street School where children assemble. Cars proceed North to C. A. grounds or other parking place.

Cars from East of Charlottetown by St. Peter's Road and Longworth Ave., turn left on Camberland (at Ris Grocery) to Prince of Wales College where children assemble. Cars proceed to parking place.

Cars crossing Hillsboro Bridge proceed along Grafton, turn right on Weymouth Street to Kent to Prince of Wales College, where children assemble. Cars proceed to parking place.

Children travelling by Rail assemble outside Canadian National Railway Station. Arriving by Rocky Point ferry assemble at Prince of Wales College. Spring Park School assemble at Prince Street School. Saint Avaris School assemble at Prince of Wales College.

Prince Street School and St. Peter's assemble at West Kent School. The following assemble at their own school: West Kent, Queen Square, Rochford Square, Notre Dame.
