## Says At Least Three Mothers Saw Sons P.M.'s

TORONTO (CP)—Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen, 84, only surviving former Conservative prime minister, Friday corrected a statement that Mrs. William T. Diefenbaker is the only Canadian mother who has seen her son become head of the government.

The report was carried from Prince Albert, Sask., April 1 by The Canadian Press.

The mother of at least two other prime ministers also saw their sons assume office. One was Mrs. Eunice Laird Borden mother of Sir Robert Borden who was elected Conservative prime minister in October, 1911. Mrs. Borden died in 1915 while her son was in office.

Mrs. William T. Diefenbaker saw her son form a minority government last June and then obtain the biggest Commons majority in Canadian history in Monday's election. Mrs. Diefenbaker, a resident of Saskatoon, Sask., is 85.

Mr. Meighen said his own mother saw him sworn in twice as prime minister.

Mr. Meighen succeeded Sir Robert when the wartime prime minister retired in 1920. Later defeated, Mr. Meighen again was prime minister during the "shadow government" of a few days in 1926.

"My mother allowed things very carefully in those days and took a great interest," Mr. Meighen said.

"She never tried to advise me, though. My goodness, in those days we were buried in advisers. Later on she moved from Ottawa up here to be near me in Toronto."

## Dosco Reports Profit For Year

MONTREAL (CP)—Dominion Coal Company, Ltd., and its subsidiaries have reported a consolidated net profit of \$481,029 for 1947, compared to \$184,887 the preceding year.

Operating income after mining, selling and administration expenses, amounted to \$4,045,972, against \$2,225,695 in 1957 from \$3,559,490 at the end of 1956.

Depreciation provision was \$1,699,447 against \$1,597,309. Deficit was reduced to \$2,225,695 in 1957 from \$3,559,490 at the end of 1956.

Working capital stood at \$2,995,982 at Dec. 31, 1957 against \$1,700,358 at the corresponding date the previous year.

Coal sales totalled 3,771,808 in 1957 against 4,435,681. Production was 4,304,672 tons last year against 4,238,836.

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market's loss last week was the worst of 1958.

An estimated \$4,000,000,000 was knocked off the quoted value of stocks listed on the New York Stock Exchange, based on the fall in the Associated Press 60-stock average. It dropped \$3.20 to \$159.50.

The latest decline has stretched over eight consecutive sessions, including one day when prices were uneven. Last week's big drop was accomplished in four trading days since the week was shortened by a Good Friday holiday. It was the second straight weekly fall.

While the market lost ground all four days, the worst tumble came Wednesday when vigorous selling brought the sharpest break since Jan. 10.

1,367 issues traded 887 fell, 308 rose and 176 were unchanged. Most active issues on the American Stock Exchange included Florida Canada Corp., off 1/2 at 12.

Most active issues on the New York Stock Exchange were Chrysler, off 2% at 48 1/2; U.S. Steel, off 1% at 56 1/2; and Bethlehem Steel, off 1% at 37 1/2.

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel production has hit a low in the current recession and may dip even lower, the magazine Steel reports.

Steel output dropped two points last week to 48.5 per cent of rated capacity. Ingot production was down to 1,298,000 net tons.

Sluggish steel mill operations were reflected in the price of scrap metal which slipped 17 cents a ton for prime grades. The magazine's composite scrap price stood at \$34.22 a ton last week.

Factors which may force steel operations even lower, Steel says, were:

Steel buyers will replace some steel used in manufacturing, but no buildup of depleted inventories is expected for four to five months;

Two large household appliance firms are planning production cuts;

With over 30 per cent of the new Edsel automobiles still unsold, the Ford Motor Company will stop production next year of the two top-priced models.

Factors which may help the sagging steel industry listed by the magazine:

Construction is picking up influenced by stopups of work on the St. Lawrence Seaway and state highway building programs;

A railroad is taking bids for \$12,000,000 worth of equipment; The government will spend \$3,600,000,000 on guided missiles this year.
