

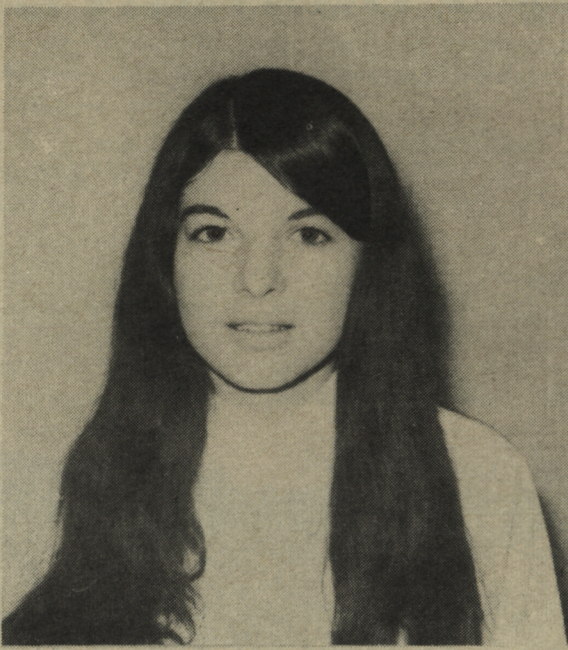

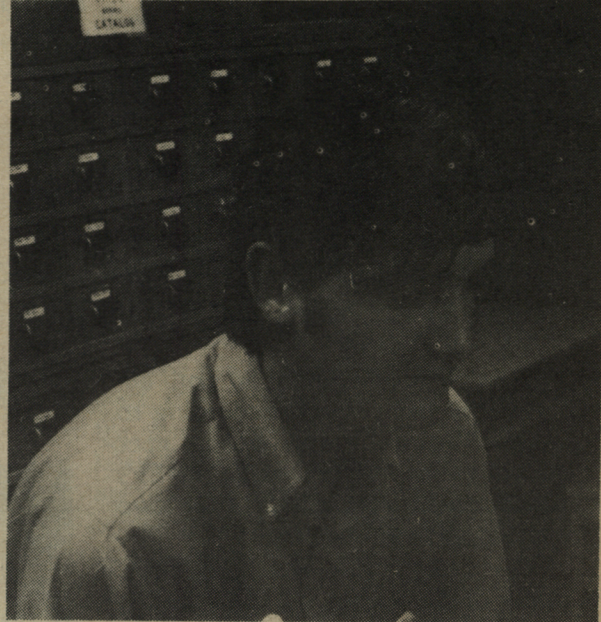
CLAUDE BUOTE

ably from faculty, will go to Ottawa where the show is being produced in the studios of CJOH-TV.

The format of the show is similar to "Reach for the Top". There will be an "Academic Advisor" to make rulings and a moderator, Bill Walker. Participating Universities will receive scholarships of an as yet unknown nature (Vague-isn't it), with the winning university in each contest getting a bigger one than the loser. An interesting feature of the game enables a winning team to keep playing and winning scholarships until it is beaten.

Part of the half-hour show will be used to blurb the participating universities. Each university is expected a 16 millimeter silent colour film about points of interest on the campus. George Welch, head of UPEI's Audio-Visual department is expected to do this. One member of the panel will be designated to read a description of the campus, an accompaniment to the film.

A series of 'challenge' matches between schools in Canada, Britain and the United States (for example, between U. of Toronto and Columbia) is included in the series.

According to Executive Producer Lorne Freed, the questions range from 'poetry to politics, art to Astronomy and sports to Science.'

'University Challenge' is intended by CTV to be a program which truly reflects our education institutions.
