EGGS AND POULTRY — Egg production in the Province continues to hold about the same position as last week, reports Mr. F. M. Nash, district inspector of Poultry Products. Sections where pullets are concentrated show receipts as increasing. Sales are slightly dragged but no accumulation is noted. Producers are receiving for ungraded eggs delivered Grade A Large 57c, A Medium 48c, A Small 35c, B 42c, C 27c. Dealers are quoting for graded pack delivered AL 65c, AM 57c, AS 43c, B 50c, C 35c and quoting retailers for graded pack AL 68-9c, AM 60-1c, AS 67-9c, AS 55c, B 63-5c, C 48-50c. To Boost British Livestock In Canada

Mr. Thomas Allsop, a Senior Livestock Officer of the U. K. Ministry of Agriculture and Mr. Angus M. Petrie, a Senior Livestock Officer of the Department of Agriculture for Scotland, are touring Canada this month.

The main purpose of their visit is to spread the good name of United Kingdom stock. They will tour the big autumn fairs—Mr. Allsop will visit the Toronto Winter Fair, and Mr. Petrie the Ottawa Fair—and be available to give authoritative information about U. K. breeds.

There has been a good deal of appreciative comment on the part of Canadians on the good done on earlier and similar tours. In his report on the 1950 tour, Mr. Allsop stated that there was potentially a larger market than at present for U. K. stock in Canada, and on the basis of his report the Ministry put certain proposals before the Breed Societies.

Mr. Allsop left for Canada on October 2nd in advance of his Scottish colleague, to contact breeders who bought British stock at the gift sale for flood relief held at Brandon, Man. in 1950. Mr. Petrie, who will leave for Canada on October 23rd, will cover the west and Mr. Allsop the east.

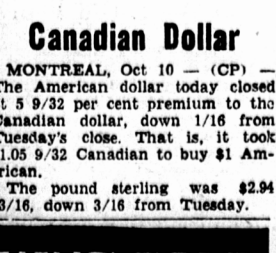
