**Labor-Management Effort
Can Pave Way To Success**

MONTREAL (CP) — F. G. Malo, a labor relations expert for Dominion Tar and Chemical Company Limited, says labor-management co-operation can help pave the way to successful economic planning in Canada.

Mr. Malo said in an interview one of the major problems of successful planning is the relocation and re-training of displaced workers.

Transferred employees naturally want to retain their seniority," he said. "Those at the receiving end—in the plants where the displaced workers are headed—take a dim view of this, because they would lose some of their seniority."

"Your neighbor gets your sympathy only until he becomes a burden to you. This is human nature."

DISCUSS PROBLEMS

Domtar has held two meetings of labor and management executives to discuss common problems. Mr. Malo said union leaders generally agreed co-operation at the local level would solve many problems, but "they can't impose unfavorable decisions on their constituents."

"We must educate workers on the necessity of these measures in the face of changing economic conditions," he said. "We always alert the union as soon as possible if a lay-off is imminent."

"We have had situations

where we were forced to close down a plant, discharging about 100 employees. We offered to retrain and place them in new positions. Only 60 per cent would so much as talk to us."

"The rest were interested only in drawing their severance pay and getting out of our hair," he said.

OFFERS SOLUTIONS

Mr. Malo said government legislation allowing transferred workers to retain their seniority might provide a solution to the problem.

"One company alone cannot cope with the situation of transferring workers. We believe by getting labor and management together — two of the three groups involved in planning — the third, government, can come in too."

"We are trying to muster enough élan to convince workers at the union local level that we are right and that their co-operation would be the best for all," he said.

**New Western Canada Bank
Announced By James Coyne**

WINNPEG (CP) — Plans for a new Western Canada bank have been placed in this week's Canada Gazette.

It is hoped the charter will be approved by Parliament early in the new year. While the initial impetus is being provided by a Toronto financial group, Mr. Coyne said at a press conference, "it is intended that Western Canadians will have an opportunity to acquire a majority of the shares

and provide a majority of the directors." Head office and first branches will be in Winnipeg. When these are established, branches will be opened in Vancouver and "as soon as possible" in other cities in Western Canada.

\$10,000,000 IN CAPITAL
Authorized capital will be \$10,000,000 divided into 1,000,000 shares of \$10 par value. Mr. Coyne said it is expected total capital funds will be at least \$3,000,000, about half subscribed in Toronto, before operations start.

The Toronto organizing group is chiefly associated with York Trust and Savings Corporation and Wellington Financial Corporation Limited.

It includes Sinclair Stevens, president of York and Wellington; Mr. Coyne, chairman of the board of York; and Philip MacDonald, managing director of York Prominent among the Winnipeg backers is E. P. Nesbitt, president and mortgage manager of Crabb and Company.

The bank will make no attempt to compete for the accounts of large corporations, Mr. Coyne said. It will provide the usual banking services, invest in federal, provincial and municipal government bonds, insure National Housing Act mortgages, and make personal loans and commercial loans to small businesses.

An agency will be maintained in Toronto for money-market dealings. It is hoped to open regular banking operations later in Ontario and perhaps other parts of Canada.

OTTAWA (CP) — Promotion of chief superintendent Frederick A. Regan, 52, to the rank of assistant commissioner of the RCMP was announced here.

A native of Westville, N.S., he has been at RCMP headquarters here since 1960 handling the planning and establishment branch.

Assistant Commissioner Regan succeeds Malcolm F. A. Lindsay who recently was named deputy commissioner.

The new assistant commissioner is a graduate of Acadia and Dalhousie Universities. He joined the RCMP in Ottawa 31 years ago and has served at Lethbridge, Calgary, Edmonton, Halifax and Toronto.

He was in charge of criminal investigation at Halifax between 1962 and 1969, and commanded the Southwestern Ontario force from Toronto for two years before coming to Ottawa.
