

Stars In 2-0 Win Over Anchors To Deadlock Local League Semi-Finals

A two-run rally in the bottom half of the sixth inning was the deciding factor that sent the East End Stars to a 2-0 victory over the West End Anchors at Memorial Field Sunday that deadlocked their best of three semi-final series at one game each in City Baseball League playoff competition.

It was the final feature to a double baseball bill that gave local diamond fans plenty of smart baseball action, probably the best all round afternoon of entertainment witnessed here this year.

Playing scoreless ball for five innings, both teams were really sharp on their plays that saw them retire the opposition in rapid fire order but proved a heart-breaker for moundman Charley Ryan when he ended up the losing pitcher on a two-hit performance, while his winning opposite number, Lefty McAleer, was tagged for five hits.

With one man away in the bottom half of the sixth, it was centerfielder Glen Matheson's error that sent Anchors sliding to defeat. Leaving his position at centre to come over for a high fly by McAleer into Jack Burke's territory at left field, Matheson made a high stab for the ball and dropped it to put McAleer safe at second on a two base error.

Singling, Kenny MacKenzie sent McAleer to third and was batted in by Irv MacKinnon for the winning run. Gus Flynn batted MacKenzie home for the insurance marker.

Anchors tried hard for a comeback in the top of the seventh, but a beautiful shoe-string catch by leftfielder Malcolm MacFadyen on a hard hit by Jack Burke, a smart pick-off at first by catcher Arnold McCallum, and a strike out by McAleer ended the ball game. The pickoff came when Des Trainor took too long a lead off first after getting there on a walk and was cut short

with McCallum's sharp throw to first baseman Charley Ready. McAleer struck out six batters and walked one for his winning performance while Ryan whiffed two and walked none.

Wielding the heavy bats during the game were Maurice Williams, Merlyn MacKenzie and Donnie MacLeod who all collected triples, while MacKenzie also banged out a double for a 1000 performance on two trips to the plate.

Paying little heed to an almost steady downpour of rain that rendered jumping pits and cinder track sodden and slippery, a strong band of athletes from the Antigonish Highland Society carried off top honors in both the senior and junior divisions at the annual P. E. I. Track and Field Meet held over Memorial Field yesterday afternoon.

Chalking up a total of 81 points in the senior events and 25 in the junior bracket, Antigonish topped off the Charlottetown Abegweit Club who had 45 1-2 points and 20 points to garner the runner-up position in the senior and junior divisions respectively. Representing Saint John, Bill Keleher placed third in a one-man team performance for third place in senior competition with 6 1-2 points.

John "Tink" Kyle led the Antigonish team to victory with a 29-point performance to cop off individual senior honors while Wendal Barrett of Abies ran him close, second with 18 points for the runner-up spot.
