Retains Faint Hopes Of Continuing Hockey Career

GRAND'MERE, Que. (CP)—An eye injury has apparently ended a promising hockey career for Jacques Marcotte, a wiry little goaltender who was struck down on the brink of the big time. Marcotte suffered a severe injury to his right eye last February while participating in his first practice with Toronto Maple Leafs of the National Hockey League. He was left with only 40 per cent vision in the damaged eye. "I guess my playing days are over," said the 23-year-old Marcotte Tuesday. He was selected the Quebec Hockey League's top rookie the season before the fatal accident. "Doctors have told me the chances of my vision in the right eye improving are practically none. I'm not sure where I can go from here."

Retains Faint Hope

But he still retains a faint hope he might, by some miracle, regain enough vision to continue the career that was his ambition since he was a young boy. "I see an eye doctor every two months in the hope there might be some improvement and I'm going to see a specialist in Boston shortly." "Hockey is my life. I've wanted to play the game for as long as I can remember. It's what I live for." Dr. Hugh Smythe, Toronto's team physician, diagnosed the injury following the accident as "minor damage to the retina and the mounting of the lens." Marcotte, five feet, seven inches tall and 145 pounds, is the property of New York Rangers of the NHL now. He was acquired by Toronto from New York late last season in exchange for \$5,000 and the rights to junior-age centre Bill Kennedy. But as a result of the accident the deal was nullified and Marcotte's contract was returned to the Rangers. Marcotte is single. He lives with his parents in this community 100 miles northeast of Montreal. He is not employed now.
