A rumor is current at Montreal, that Hon. Peter Mitchell is thinking of vacating Northumberland and seeking a constituency in the province of Quebec, but that gentleman declines to either deny or confirm the report.

Sir John Macdonald in an interview, said that O'Brien and Dillon as British subjects have every right to speak in Canada should they come, and thinks it highly improbable that they will be arrested should they cross the line. The Montreal Irish League having extended an invitation to the Irish agitators, it is quite expected that they will accept of it.

Two hundred and fifty cattle from the Stewart ranch arrived down at Montreal on the 6th inst., for shipment to British markets. They are the finest lot ever shipped from Canada, and will average 1,100 pounds when killed and dressed.

At a meeting in London on the 5th inst., the Imperial Federation League unanimously adopted Fowler's motion which, supported by Gen. Laurier and Mr. Doherty, Canadians, declared the present an opportune moment to consult Canadian League on steps to promote closer union. Gen. Laurier exonerated America from any desire to injure England or Canada through the McKinley act. He attached no importance to the anti-tariff victories just reported. The invitation over the new tariff, he said would pass away long before the next election, and the Republicans would undoubtedly gain by the passage of the bill.
