## Plan Conference Steelworkers

PITTSBURGH (AP)—President David J. McDonald of the United Steelworkers Wednesday summoned members of the USW's 170-member wage policy committee to meet in Chicago May 14-15.

A union spokesman said the meeting was called to discuss the economic situation. McDonald said recently that 250,000 steelworkers are unemployed and another 400,000 are working less than 40 hours a week.

The union has a membership of 1,200,000.

The 32-member executive board of the USW will meet in advance of the wage policy group in Chicago. Usually the executive board makes recommendations to the wage policy committee.

McDonald said recently that he had received informal feelers from some steel executives about the union forgoing a wage increase due July 1 under terms of a three-year contract signed in 1956.

But the union president said no such move was being considered. The steelworkers are scheduled to receive a 9.1-cent-hourly increase and other fringe benefits July 1. Workers now earn a base wage of \$1.96 an hour.
