

SOVIET CHIEFS TO VISIT BRITAIN

Coalition Aiming At Independence Takes Early Lead In Malaya Polling

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaya. (Reuters)—An alliance of Malay, Chinese and Indian organizations, pledged to seek Malayan independence by 1959, was assured of victory today in the federation's first election.

The alliance was expected to be routed on this week to form a government as a runaway victory seemed certain in the fight for 52 elected seats on the hitherto wholly-nominated Legislative Council.

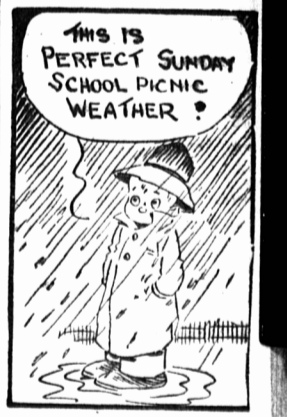
