A By-Law Relating to Horses and Carriages, and for the Purpose of Taxing the Same.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows:— 1st. There shall be paid by every owner...

2. The following notice and certificate shall be deposited with every person owning or being the owner or keeper of such horse, carriage and sleigh...

3. Any person or persons keeping or owning any horse, carriage or sleigh, and who shall neglect or refuse to make due return...

4. Any person becoming possessed of or of owning or keeping any horse, carriage or sleigh during any part of the period between the first day of January, 1881, and the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1881...

5. The tax aforesaid shall be paid on or before the expiration of ten days after it has been applied for by the collector or other person duly authorized...

6. Horses and Trucks owned and used by Licensed Truckmen, are hereby exempted from taxation.

7. Any person or persons guilty of an infraction of the provisions of this By-Law, shall, upon conviction in the City Court of the Stipendiary Magistrate...

A By-Law for levying and specifying the rate of an assessment on real estate and incomes in the City of Charlottetown.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1. The rate of assessment for the year commencing the 1st day of January, A. D. 1881, and ending 31st December, A. D. 1881, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one-quarter cent on every dollar of the value of real estate within the City of Charlottetown...

2. The rate of assessment for the year commencing the 1st day of January, A. D. 1881, and ending 31st December, A. D. 1881, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one cent on every dollar of the amount of the net yearly income, salaries or receipts of all persons, partnerships and corporations...

A By-Law for allowing a Rate of Discount on the Assessments on Real Estate and Incomes for the current year.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1. A discount at the rate of two and one-half per cent shall be allowed to all tax payers who shall, on or before the Twentieth day of June, A. D. 1881, pay to the City Clerk, at his office, the taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Incomes.
