Gormley Offering For Ward 1 Seat

Dean of the Council and veteran of 18 years of service to Ward 1, Arthur Gormley has announced he will again be a candidate in the coming civic election. He was first elected to City Council in the February election of 1950 and has never been defeated since. In fact he has been returned a majority of times by acclamation while winning decisively on the rare occasions when opposition offered. Almost his entire lifetime has been spent on the waterfronts of the Maritimes and following the Second War he was employed with the Newfoundland Shipping Company for seven years before forming his own stevedoring contracting company. A longtime chairman of the

police committee, he has in the past served on all council committees excepting finance. At the present time he is chairman of the public property committee and also serves as a member of committees dealing with streets, police and rink. So far rumors of opposition to his candidacy have been only rumors as little tendency to contest the ward is evident. It had been suggested that H.E. Hyndman, former finance chairman, might return to the civic scene, but he definitely stated yesterday he would not be a candidate in the ward. Another possibility, Arthur McInnis, insurance broker who opposed Mr. Gormley two years ago, is still undecided on the 1966 contest.

Two Drivers Fined \$50

Erskine Noble Smith, city, was assessed \$50 and costs or 15 days for failing to report an accident when he appeared in City Police Court yesterday. Magistrate A.J. Haslam, QC, presided. The accused was also fined \$10 and costs or five days for operating a vehicle without a license. Thomas Dawson, city, charged with driving while his license was suspended, was fined \$50 and costs or 10 days. Wilfred B. Burke, city, charged with failing to provide certain information under the Income Tax Act on demand, had his case adjourned, by consent of both counsels to Feb. 15. Lloyd A. MacLean, W in shoe, received a fine of \$5 and costs or two days for driving the wrong way on a one-way street. A city resident, charged with causing unseemly noise, was given a 20 day sentence, commitment held pending good behavior. A Victoria resident and a Murray Harbor resident were each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days for illegal possession of liquor.

K of C Council Opens Series Of Programs

The Knights of Columbus, Charlottetown Council, on Jan. 11, opened their first program of a series designed to delve into the doctrinal decrees resulting from the Vatican Council. Rev. James R. Kelly of the St. Dunstan's University staff gave the introductory talk. The place of Man in the plan of Creation, with particular reference to man's liberty, and the phenomena of change, was the theme of Father Kelly's talk. Father Kelly stated that, "the biggest factor with which we have to live today is automation. The problem is, how to live in a leisure society, how to dare to be fully human?" The meeting was chaired by the lecturer who introduced the speaker and the subject. The Good of the Order section invited the ladies to participate in a meeting for the first time. They are also invited to participate in the remainder of the program. This new program was conceived, after some study, by a committee organized at the provincial level. The committee responsible is composed of Vincent MacIntyre as chairman, Rev. Faber MacDonald and Ian MacDonald.

Stolen Goods Case Brings Term In Jail

SUMMERSIDE - A town resident, Wilfred John Blacquiere, was sentenced to four months in Prince County Jail yesterday when he was found guilty by Magistrate R. S. Hinton, QC, in the town court on a charge of unlawful possession of stolen goods. A tire and rim as well as a number of tools, the property of Fred MacKinnon, Summerside, and valued at under \$50, were found in the accused's truck. Four crown witnesses were heard including Mr. MacKinnon and his son, Otis MacKinnon. The other witness for the crown were Sgt. Harry MacKey and Constable Gordon Grady of the town police. The accused, who conducted his own defence, called no witnesses. He stated that although the tire and tools were found in his truck, no attempt had been made to conceal them and that they were openly visible to anyone who looked in the vehicle. He stated he found the goods on Holman's Wharf and had just picked them up and placed them in his vehicle. In his summation crown prosecutor George McMahon told the court of the accused's lengthy record and stated it was only last August that he had appeared on a similar charge and had been sentenced to three months in jail.
