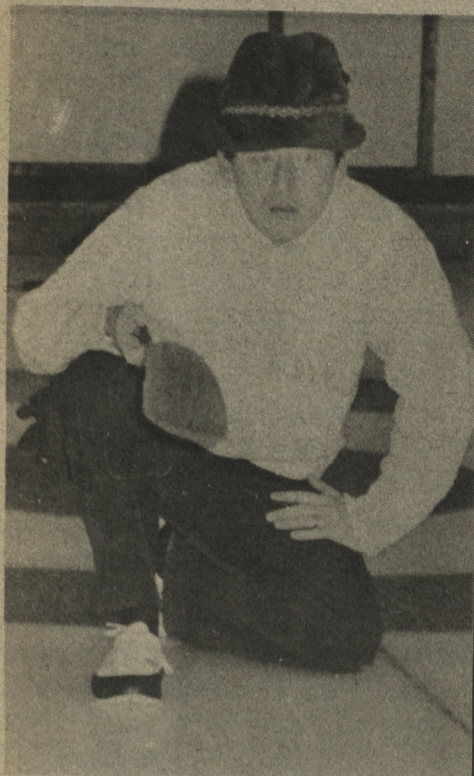


FUNSPEIL--BUSINESS CURLING
