

Drop Case Re Pension Cheque

SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP) — Indictments against two persons charged with conspiring to obtain the \$150 pension cheque of Peter Murray by forgery were quashed in police court Friday because of "vagueness" in the information. Police alleged that William Peters, 35, and Mrs. Doris Bushan, 26, obtained the pensioner's cheque by forging Murray's signature on a note which was shown to a postal clerk. Defence counsel Edward J. Lahey asked that the indictment against Peters be killed because of "vagueness and duplicity" in the wording of the information. Magistrate H. S. Prince said vague wording of the informa-

tions indicated that forgery may have been committed when the information was laid, and therefore, the prime charge of conspiracy would not stand. Mrs. Bushan earlier pleaded guilty but Magistrate Prince said he would be "most lenient" in his duty to sentence her. Both she and Peters were released. The magistrate said the Crown should feel at liberty to appeal the case.

Freighter Loads 35,000 Bags Of Seed In Ch'town

The S.S. "Fort Avalon" of the Furness Line fleet arrived in Charlottetown and docked along the west side of the Railway Pier to take on a cargo of Island Potatoes. Under the command of Captain Baxter Powell of Newfoundland the 3,500 bushels of potatoes arrived here from St. John's and Port Union, Nfld., where she had taken on a large portion of her cargo in the nature of fish, which is consigned to Halifax and New York. The fish cargo is destined for transhipment on one from the Canadian National Indian ports. In this port she is being loaded with 35,000 bags of seed potato stock consigned to the port of Norfolk, Virginia. The cargo is being loaded for the Associated Shippers Incorporated.

THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

BY HIS Eminence CARDINAL McGUIGAN. "Sorrow differs from pain in that it is a state of mind. No two souls are alike, each has its own sorrow. It is unique. So it is with every being in nature. In no instance, however, is this uniqueness more striking than in the case of the human person. Every human person has a depth no other human person can sound. This is the glory of the human person. It is also the glory of his deepest sorrow. Man, among men, is necessarily lonely. Not even the most intimate loves, or the closest friendships, resolve the incommunicability of one personality to another. To some extent man can share his joys with other men, and to some extent they can share his sorrow. My joy, however, can never be your joy, nor

can my sorrow be your sorrow. There always remains an inner recess closed to all other human persons. Yet, there seems to be in man a devotedness year to communicate his joy and to seek comfort in his sorrow. It is, an ancient philosopher said, characteristic of a man in possession of some good is inwardly moved to share it. When burdened by sorrow he seeks comfort from others, moved by the conviction that they will share their good with him. KNOWLEDGE, LOVE, Will be the good of things man possesses, the best are spiritual goods, even in the natural order. Of these spiritual goods, primarily, must be accorded to knowledge and love. Knowledge and love belong together in the sense order. Love follows upon, completes and perfects knowledge. Or things to be known, and one known, to be loved, it is the highest, in the natural order of visible things, are other human persons. Properly speaking, nothing is the object of human love. Everything lower than the human person among visible realities, exists for man. Man is the first among visible beings because he exists for himself, at least relatively so. He has an end to be achieved which it is possible for him to miss. Hence only at the human level, and above it, but not below it, is tragedy possible. To love another human person, having one's own end, is to desire that that other person achieve the end for which he exists, and to employ all available means to assist him in achieving it. Love properly leads to action, to giving oneself. The fullest expression of purely human love is that which exists between a husband and wife. In properly ordered conjugal love there is an inner urge to provide for the other, to give, even the good of the personality itself. While the other lacks that good there remains always something that he does not have. This good, the personality itself, as it has been remarked, is precisely what cannot be given. Human love, even the pure love of man for woman is bounded, defined, by the incommunicability of the unique personality. In each personality
