PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Debate on the Address.

BORDEN OF HALIFAX DELIVERS AN EFFECTIVE SPEECH.

An Amendment to the Address to be Moved.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, April 6.—Mr. Borden, of Halifax, resumed the Yukon discussion contending that Mr. Sifton's speech was no adequate answer to the charges made against his administration. He read a large number of additional communications, some exceedingly direct and specific charges of unfairness, corruption and negligence on the part of the Government officials.

Mr. Borden dwelt impressively on the fact that seven months elapsed after the charges of corruption in the Yukon were made before an investigation began; that the investigation when it did take place was an inquiry into charges against particular friends and favorites of Mr. Sifton while the court is subordinate, and a cousin of Mr. Sifton's. Even now, inquiry was limited to acts which occurred before last August, though it was declared that serious offences have gone on ever since.

Mr. Borden continued, making a very effective speech.

The Opposition caucus that was held yesterday decided to move an amendment to the address setting forth that the reported irregularities in the Yukon are sufficiently grave to call for an investigation by a commission of judges.

Mr. Foster will move for a return of all the liquor taken in the Yukon since 1896.

DOMESTIC TRAGEDY

A Farmer Puts His Wife Out of Doors and Kills His Child.

MEGANTIC, Que., April 6.—News of a dreadful domestic tragedy has reached here. A farmer named Boucher, living in the seventh range of Inverness, on Monday had a quarrel with his wife over some trivial matter. The quarrel ended for the time being and the couple went to bed. In the middle of the night the man arose from his bed, put his wife out of doors and proceeded to murder his eleven month's old child. He first strangled the infant and then put its body into the stove, after a little while, the father, who is charitably said to be insane, went to the stove and taking out the baby's half consumed body threw it into a snowbank near the house. The murderer is under guard in a neighbor's house, whether he fled after committing this awful deed.

Don't Want to take Chances.

SIR.—At a recent meeting of the shareholders and patrons of the Morell Dairying Company, a question of much importance to all the companies was introduced by the directors. It appears that the cheese buyers at Charlottetown have refused to pay for cheese on delivery; and the directors don't feel inclined to take the responsibility. It seems unfair that they should be expected to take chances in delivering thousands of dollars worth of cheese to parties who are to them unknown financially. The meeting was of the opinion that dealers should be prepared to pay for the goods on delivery or arrange with the banks to guarantee the payment. As matters stand things are not satisfactory, and we think that cheese should be sold like flour and that others that farmers should take the chances. We don't cast reflection on any buyers, but claim that the system in practice is not business. Some Ontario shippers, last year, suffered by this business system. This is a matter for the Central Association to take up at once. We are not sure but that it would pay our Island factories to send a good live man to the Old Country to look after the Island out-put. Such a move, we believe, would result favorably to the patrons, and something like this must be done if our local buyers persist in their present course.

SOCIALISM IN GERMANY.

Party Being Disrupted by the Demolition of its Views.

BERLIN, April 2.—The Socialist party is being disrupted internally in consequence of a book written by Herr Bernstein one of its chief intellectual leaders, recently published, in which the fundamental doctrine that the poor are constantly becoming poorer and that capital is becoming more and more concentrated is strikingly disproved.

The Socialistic press admits that if the claim is correct the fundamental doctrine of the party is demolished, but the Socialist papers neither admit nor deny the truth of the allegations. The non-Socialistic press, on the other hand, points out that one by one the Socialist doctrines have shown their fallacies, and that if left alone the Socialist party will go to pieces.

Herr Bebel announced at a Socialist meeting at Jena last week that if the party split, which he considers likely, another and much more radical party will come into existence.

Easter at Vernon River.

Brilliant in the fullest sense were the Easter services in St. Joachim's Church, Vernon River. The choir, under the leadership of Mr. J. Greene, even surpassed that of former occasions. The soprano part was creditably taken by Miss Eliza O'Neill, whose sympathetic voice is so well adapted to church music. Her legate is perfect, her coloratura brilliant and accurate, and unfailingly musical. The solo at the Communion also deserves special mention, and Mr. Greene's rich basso voice was heard to full advantage. The other singers excelled themselves in their particular parts, particularly the organist, Miss Marie O'Neill. The altar was beautifully decorated, the callalilies being conspicuous against the other flowers. The Rev. Dr. Doyle preached in his usual eloquent manner a sermon appropriate to the occasion.

PALMS.

Changes in Siam.

LONDON, April 4.—The King of Siam has issued a decree to the effect that no children who are entirely naked will be henceforth allowed to play in the streets of Bangkok, and that every person over the age of 10 must be clothed from the knee to the neck. It is also a rule that all persons entering the palace must wear socks. Non-compliance with this order is to be punished by fine.

The decree insists especially on girls and women wearing jackets, but as this is not the mode there, it is anticipated that there will be considerable trouble with the fair ones. A policeman is considered competent to decide when a person is insufficiently clad, or when a child is over 10 years of age, and his judgment on these points is to be final.

An immense timber cradle has been under construction at Seattle, Washington, during the past three months, and the last section of the odd-looking craft was launched on March 20. It is thought that the cradle will have a capacity of 3,000,000 feet of lumber. Many lumber shippers are afraid the craft will never reach San Francisco, its destination.
