Mr. and Mrs. John W. Robertson, Kingsboro, had as their recent guests, Mr. and Mrs. Jack Stewart, Charlottetown.

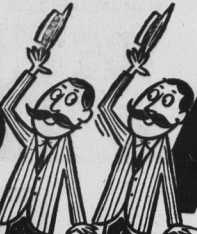

Mrs. Walter Dixon, East Baltic, Mrs. Regie Rose, Kingsboro, motored to Charlottetown recently.

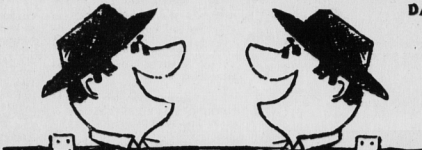

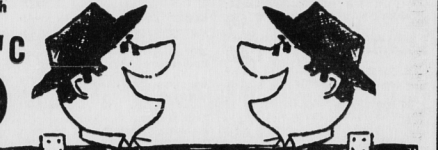

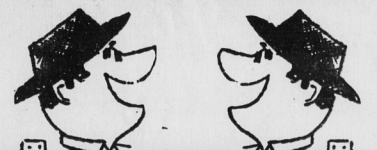
