

Jury Gets Evidence From Girl

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP)—Murder defendant Carl Ann Fugate—hands folded in her lap, her voice generally firm—told a jury Wednesday of the life she lived before the Charles Starkweather killings loomed for her to notoriety.

The 15-year-old brunette took the stand as the first defence witness in her trial for first-degree murder. She is accused of aiding and abetting her condemned boy friend on one of 11 killings attributed to him.

Carl nearly broke down at one point. Her voice choked and she dabbed her eyes as she identified snapshot pictures of her slain mother, Mrs. Marion Bartlett, and a slain baby half-sister Betty Jean Bartlett.

Of her step-father Marion Bartlett, also killed, Carl said: "He had his ways but I got along with him."

STATE RESTS

Carl took the stand after the state rested its case in a trial that began 2½ years ago.

Carl is charged with murder in the death of Robert Jensen, Bennett, Neb., schoolboy. The same count brought Starkweather, 19, a death sentence.

Prosecutor Elmer Scheele completed Wednesday a reading of a word-for-word account of an interrogation Carl underwent Feb. 2 and 3, shortly after she and Starkweather were captured in Wyoming.

"I didn't know he (Starkweather) was going to kill any of them," she was quoted as saying. But she also acknowledged that she had told Starkweather on one occasion during the flight that she herself was so mad at one of the victims that "I could kill him."

PLAN NEW BRIDGE

The fair, one of the largest in the world, will feature a wide variety of prize animals from Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island. The fair is expected to attract thousands of visitors and will be a major event in the city.

Driving While Impaired Charge Brings \$150 Fine

TWO men appeared in Charlotetown Police Court Wednesday morning before Magistrate J. Martin facing charges of driving while intoxicated.

A Union Road resident pleaded guilty to a lesser charge of driving while impaired and was handed a fine of \$150 and costs or 30 days in jail.

Following evidence given by Constable Leo MacDougall, defence counsel Gerald Foster asked that the plea of not guilty to a drunk driving charge be returned to a plea of guilty to a more while impaired charge.

Magistrate Martin felt that this was one case where the plea should be changed.

A Goodwill Avenue resident pleaded not guilty to a driving while intoxicated charge. The case was adjourned to November 14.

A North Rustico man appearing on a charge of vagrancy was released on a \$250 peace bond.

J.O.C. Campbell, Q.C., appearing for the accused, told the court that the incident was part of a long standing feud between the accused and Benoit S. Martin also of South Rustico who laid the charge.

A New London man appeared on two separate charges of assault. He pleaded not guilty to both charges that arose out of an incident at Irishtown Community Hall October 27th. The charges were placed by Mrs. Gertrude Paynter of Carleton Place and her brother-in-law Lynn Paynter.

Following evidence of three witnesses the case was adjourned to November 19th.

A Summerside construction firm was charged with unlawfully allowing a dextrous substance (oil) to escape into a stream frequented by trout. A spokesman for the firm pleaded guilty to the charge and paid a fine of \$50 and costs.
