Senate Debates Market For Fisheries Products

OTTAWA, June 30—(CP)—Markets for Canadian fisheries products and Commonwealth trade occupied the senate in an extended debate. During debate on a report by the senate finance committee, Senator J. J. Hayes Doane (L—New Brunswick) suggested intensive government investigation and negotiation to find outlets for Canadian fisheries products.

Markets abroad to take up surpluses. Maritime industry was not in as happy a trade position as other parts of Canada. Recent currency restrictions closed markets in the West Indies, Jamaica, Trinidad, British Guiana and the Barbadoes where the staple foods once were Canadian flour and fish.

Treasure Hunter Finds 8 Dubloons On Island

ADVOCATE, N.S., June 30—(CP)—Eight Spanish doubloons and parts of a skeleton have been found by a treasure hunter on tiny Isle Haute, 13 miles from Hoyt in the Bay of Fundy. Edward Rowe Snow of Marshfield, Mass., a historian whose hobby is treasure hunting, made the find in a brief visit to the island Thursday night. He found the gold with the aid of a metal detector and old charts.

Legend and charts also indicate that the Isle Haute treasure came from the Spanish galleon Senora de Victoria, captured in 1725. Snow, who sent a telegram to the Federal Finance Department to advise of his find, remained here only about 20 minutes before leaving for his home Friday. Assisting him on the island was John Fullerton, the lighthouse keeper who is the only inhabitant there.

Report Canadian Writer Facing Serious Charges

OTTAWA, June 30—(CP)—The arrest of a prominent Canadian writer has been ordered by the Justice Department, it was learned today. High informants said the Montreal man is known to have consorted with Russians in this country but declared the charge does not involve espionage or the giving of secret information to another power.

While its nature was not disclosed, it was described authoritatively as a "technical" charge. It carries a heavy penalty. The Toronto Telegram, in a news story from Montreal, said the man is a native Montrealer of Russian parents. It added it is understood that behind the charge is "a history of repeated contacts with Russia."

Senate Overrides Truman's Veto Of Immigration Bill

By Donald Sanders WASHINGTON, June 30—(AP)—A complete overhaul of United States immigration and naturalization laws was put on the statute books by Congress today over the veto of President Truman, who had contended the measure would sap U. S. leadership for peace. The bill, sponsored by Senator Pat McCarran (Dem. Nev.) and Representative Francis Walter (Dem. Pa.), was passed by the Senate by a vote of 57 to 26. That was one vote more than the two-thirds majority required to override Truman's veto, sent to Congress Wednesday.
