## Committed On Charge Of Theft To Supreme Court

At the conclusion of the preliminary hearing yesterday, Harold Clement Lee charged with theft was committed for trial in the Supreme Court of Prince Edward Island by Magistrate K.M. Martin. J.P. Nicholson appeared for the Crown and J.O.C. Campbell, Q.C. for the defence. At the request of Mr. Nicholson the hearing into the charge of public mischief was adjourned until this morning.

Three witnesses were called in connection with the theft hearing, two R.C.M.P. constables and the Deputy Chief of Police.

The two Constables, C. Peter Hill and Eric Tedford, stated that they were among the first to arrive at Hampton and both saw Lee's car parked in front of Dunstons' store. Cst. Tedford told of asking for and receiving car keys from Lee, he then placed the keys in his pocket and locked the car. Questioned whether the key was required to lock the auto, witness said "No" and explained the procedure used. He said he later gave the keys to Cst. Hill.

Cst. Hill told of receiving the keys and of being asked to look for mail in the car. He said he unlocked the vehicle and looked but found no mail. Witness said he retained the keys for a short period and then turned them over to Police Chief MacArthur.

Deputy Chief Sterns Webster, was asked by Mr. Nicholson to identify a light brown wallet and was asked where he first saw it, witness said that he had first seen it at Queen's County Jail and that it was the property of Harold Lee. The Magistrate then read the warrant to the accused, and when asked if he had anything to say, defense counsel replied "nothing"

## Court Cases At Georgetown

At magistrate's court in Georgetown, conducted by Stipendiary Magistrate Gilbert Gaudet Wednesday afternoon. A resident of Gaspereau was charged with leaving his vehicle on the highway unattended, and fined \$5.00 and costs. Five persons, one from Murray River, one from Abney, one from Greenfield, one from Bristol and another St. Peters West were all charged with driving without an operator's licence and each fined \$5.00 and costs. Two residents of Montague were both charged with driving unregistered vehicles, and were fined \$5.00 and costs. A resident of Amherst, N.S. was charged with possession of liquor not purchased at the vendors, and fined \$25.00 and costs.

## Hospital Gifts Division Campaign Now Under Way

Justice Harold L. Palmer, who is joint chairman of the Special Gifts Division of the Prince Edward Island Hospital Campaign, with Brigadier G.G.K. Peake, announced the opening of their division on Tuesday afternoon in the Game Room of the Armouries. Judge Palmer reports that attendance at the Meeting was excellent, with every team represented except one. This group has assumed responsibility for solicitation of some leading commercial and industrial interests in the immediate Charlottetown area - who, because of the great amount of money required, will be called upon for special consideration in this effort to modernize and expand the basic service departments of our Hospital.

Judge Palmer, who has been a member of the Hospital's Voluntary Board of Trustees for many years, stressed to all members of his Committee, the importance of a thoughtful, factual presentation of the urgency of improving the facilities of our Hospital. He stated: "The need has been apparent for several years and it becomes an increasing problem for our doc-

tors, nurses and technicians to give the best service with cramped and overworked physical facilities." He further stated: "A great teacher once wrote, 'Wisdom is the understanding of the heart'. This is another way of saying that great human issues such as birth, life and death, lie beyond the narrow limits of our knowledge. These things are part of all human experience, but because they transcend money and material things, their value cannot and should not be measured with the logic of the bargain counter or the reasoning of an auction sale. While this Hospital project is a tremendous undertaking in money, its implications cannot be measured in dollars and cents alone. When your mother has cancer, your child is caught in an automobile accident, your wife has to bear a child, you don't think much about money at the time; you think instantly 'where can I find immediately the best medical and hospital care available'. Sometimes this thinking can be a bit too late. It could be too late for some of us if we do not keep our hospital up-to-date and plan for the future."
