

We've seen Williams bunt the third strike more than once, and get away with it. Underwood has come through again in the clutch. He's apparently a dual personality, who gets the jitters at first base on a routine play with nothing much at stake, and is as cool as the present June Weather at the plate when the chips are down.

Who's going to stop those rampaging Abbie Intermediates? They've got a wealth of pitching material. Sneizek, MacLean and Ready are a pretty sweet looking trio to be able to call upon. Smith we don't know, but either Ryan or Whitlock could take a turn on the mound if it were necessary. They've got plenty of dynamite in those bats, though perhaps not quite as much as MCA on paper, at least, and their fielding looks as good as any defensive system in the league.

But they can be had, fellows. Get out there and take them. This is going to be a nip-and-tuck race, we predict, and the Abbie Intermediates are not going to make a runaway contest of it.

### Let's Talk It Over

We heard recently someone express the opinion that, since we have now had four ideal seasons in a row, i. e., summer and fall of 1952, winter of 1952-53, and spring of 1953, the chances are pretty strong that we'll have a poor summer. 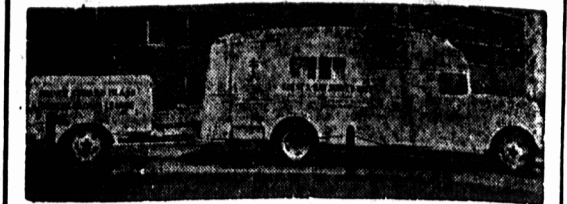

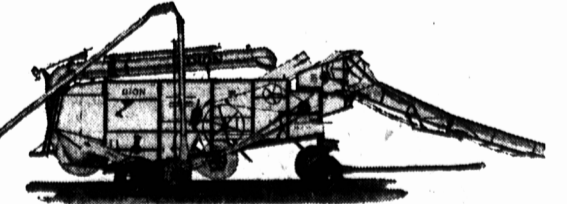
