The Transvaal War

—A story comes from Pretoria that General Botha, who commanded the Boers in the battle at Spion Kop, intimates that six British soldiers had their heads cut off in that action by their officers because they showed the white feather. Gen. Botha is quoted as saying that after the battle the bodies of six British soldiers were found on the field with their heads severed and lying from two to fifteen feet away. The decapitation, it was declared, was done as cleanly as if a guillotine had performed the work.

Lord Roberts seems disposed to fight the Boers with every means the Boers use in fighting him. He has directed to be furnished to every British soldier a copy of a paper composed for use in the field by the primate of Ireland. It is a very good prayer—humble, moderate, and sincerely pious. It calls the British cause right and great—but it could not well do less and still be fit for use by British soldiers. Though short, it is as good a prayer as any of President Kruger's. It does not make you smile when you read it, even though you sympathize with the Boers, and that is a severe test.—E. S. Martin, in Harper's Weekly.

—Astonishment is expressed in Capetown at the importance attached in England to the statements of Mr. Cronwright-Schreiner, husband of Olive Schreiner, who has been lecturing for some time in Great Britain under the auspices of the peace party. He is known here as a political weather-cock. In 1874 he issued extreme pamphlets against the Afrikaner bond, accusing it of being anti-British.
