The members were treated to delicious refreshments by Thelma Moase.

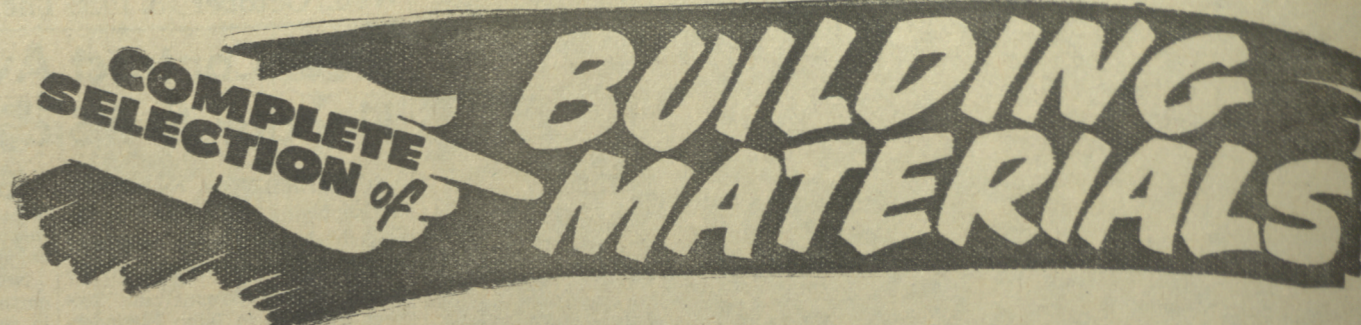
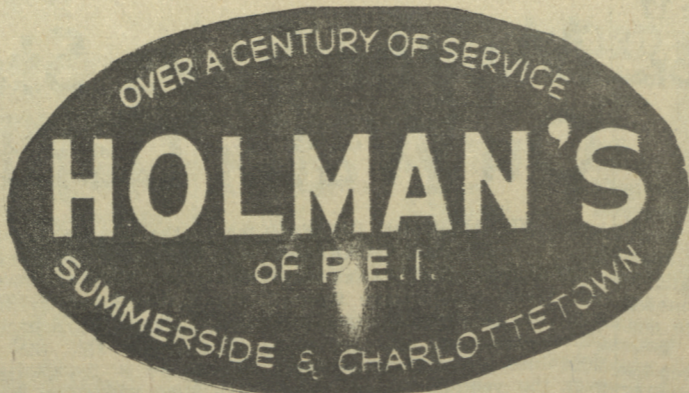
