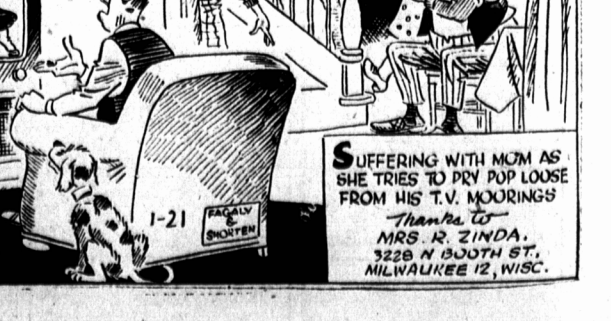

That little house on the hilltop To me, was wondrous fair, The joys of a happy childhood Were all around me there;

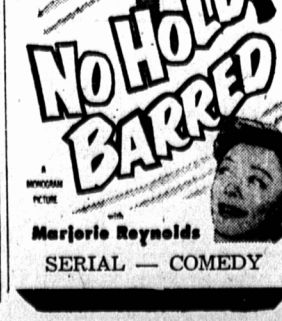
The nook beside the enchanted well, The swing beneath the trees, A garden rife with roses, And honey from the bees.
