

# Outlines Program To Aid Cerebral Palsy Victims

One of the many men who have made this year's Dominion School Boy Curling Bospital the success that it has been to F. W. McIntosh of Montreal, president of the Pepsi-Cola Company, sponsors of the annual event.

Along with his other activities, Mr. McIntosh holds the distinction of being president of another organization—that of the Cerebral Palsy Association of Quebec.

Cerebral Palsy, as many of us know, is one of the least known of recognized diseases in the world. It is only within the last few years that the world's medical profession have been able to assist those affected with the dread disease.

The function of the association, in the other provinces of Canada as well as Quebec, is to work with hospital and school officials in an effort to provide the needed equipment that goes into making life more bearable.

Over 20,000 school-aged children in Canada have Cerebral

"Although there is no complete

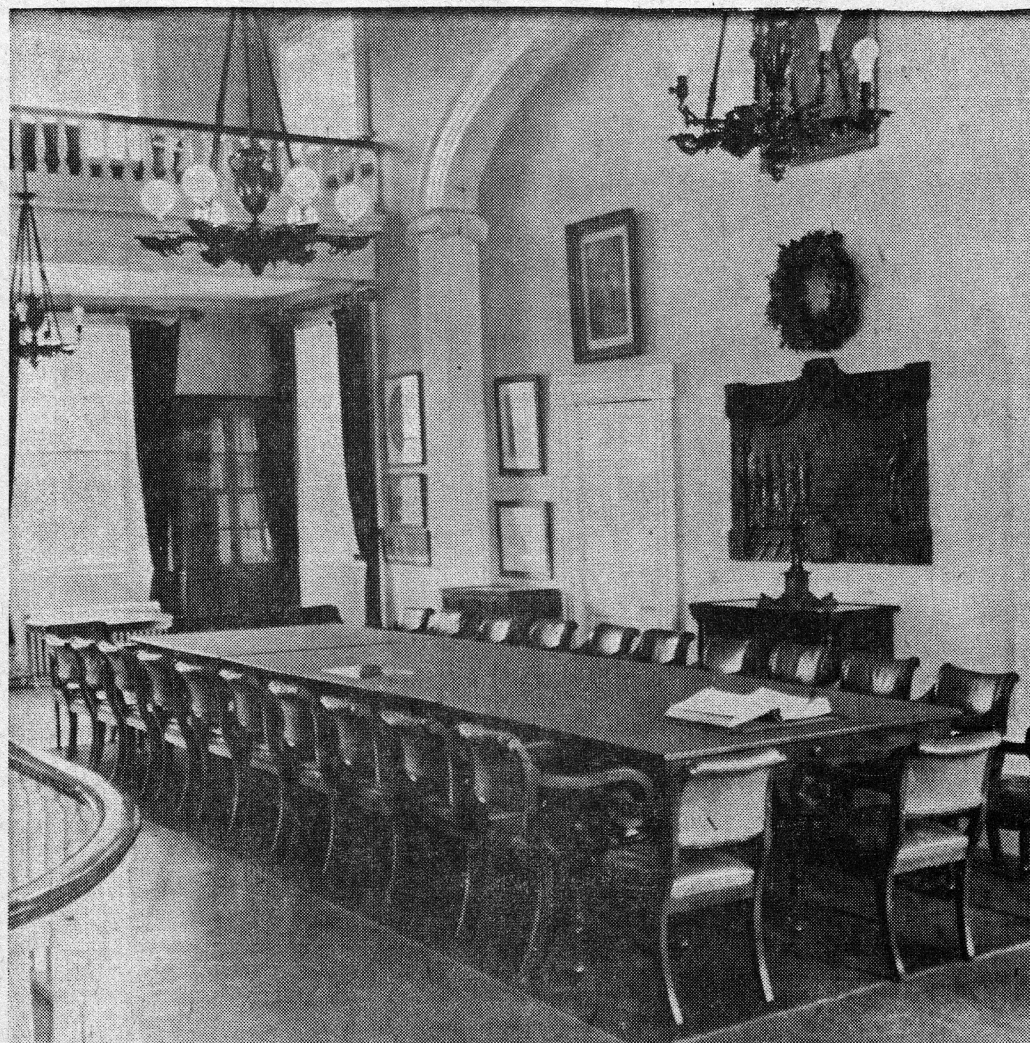
cure for Cerebral Palsy," Mr. McIntosh said, "those afflicted would be helped educational - wise and through hospital care."

When the Cerebral Palsy child becomes more mature, social activities are provided that enable him to work along side others with the same disease. These social activities include a work shop that provided the needed training that will allow the Cerebral Palsist to go out into the working world on his own.

The Association feels that the more seriously affected "should be kept at home. There they will have the family atmosphere and loving care that is a major factor in their treatment."

The main fund raising project of the association is its annual campaign. The Quebec branch will hold its fund gathering campaign during the latter stages of the month of April.

Half of the total amount accumulated will go to hospitals and schools assisting the association (Continued on page 5)

Kendoral Duchess Queen, a 17-year-old Ayrshire cow, owned and bred by W. W. Anderson and Son, St. Peter's Bay, recently gave birth to twin calves.

This Island-bred cow is recognized in Ayrshire circles as one of the outstanding females in the breed. As a 4-year-old she made a top record of 15,134 lbs. of milk containing 640 lbs. of butterfat.

Two of her progeny, Kendoral Bright Boy, and Kendoral Fashion King were used extensively in the Ontario artificial insemination unit.

The dam of Kendoral Duchess Queen was Raeburn Florrie, who died in her tenth year. Her record was 12,066 lbs. milk, 506 lbs. butterfat. She was bred by Earl MacRae, New Wiltshire. Sire of the Duchess cow, Fairvue Duchess King, (preferential one-star) was bred by A. MacRae and Son, Central Royalty. Sire of the twins was Fairvue Enterprise.
