## RCMP Band To Perform In Four Island Centres

The famed 50-piece band of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police will appear in four island centres during a tour of the province July 17 through July 20.

The band's itinerary was released this morning. Led by band director and RCMP supervisor of music, Supt. E.J. Lydall, the band will arrive in the city Tuesday afternoon July 17 and will stage a band concert at Victoria Park the same evening. If rain interferes, the concert will be held at Queen Charlotte High School.

Prior to leaving for Montague and Souris the next day, the band will stage a marching ceremony in Charlottetown at 11 a.m. Wednesday, marching along Richmond, Great George and Queen streets.

A marching ceremony will be held along Main Street in Montague at 3:45 in the afternoon, and a concert will be given on St. Mary's School grounds at Souris in the evening. An alternate site for the concert in case of rain will be the Souris Legion Hall.

Thursday evening, the band will divide into two units. One unit will be at a formal dance at HMCS Queen Charlotte, at which the band's 13-piece orchestra will play.

On Friday, July 20, the final day of their stay, the band will spend the day at Summerside and will participate in the Summerside Lobster Carnival and Livestock Exhibition.

## Theft Charge Results From Rental Of Auto

Following the testimony of one crown witness, Maurice MacQuarrie, Charlottetown, was remanded until July 17 for consideration of his case by Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday. Bail was set at \$500, with two sureties of \$250 each.

MacQuarrie, who is charged with the theft of an automobile, the property of Goodspeed's of P.E.I. Ltd., counselled by John P. Nicholson, elected trial by magistrate and pleaded not guilty to the offence.

The lone witness, Chesley Lockhart, general manager of Goodspeed's, told of renting a 1961 Chevrolet car to the accused on June 25, and that a one-day extension of the rental had been given on June 27.

When the vehicle was not returned by 5 p.m. June 28, he said he became alarmed and on June 30 requested the city police to attempt to recover the car.

On July 6, a warrant for the arrest of the accused was sworn out by the witness. The witness stated that on July 9 he was in the Montague area on business, when he located the allegedly stolen car in a driveway. Taking possession of the car, Mr. Lockhart said he drove it back to Charlottetown.

Cross-examined by Mr. Nicholson, the witness said that when he saw the car on July 9, the accused was not in the process of driving the car back to Charlottetown.

Mr. Nicholson asked the witness that since the car had been rented to the accused, could it not be considered that it was still out on rent, and so, what amount would the accused owe the firm under those circumstances. The witness replied "3170, less the value of the car."

**BREAK-ENTRY CASE**  
A further remand for sentence until July 11, was given Basil John Perry, Charlottetown, on the charge of breaking and entering the men's wear store of Kelly and Macneil, Great George Street, and therein committing the indictable offence of theft.

James Girdley Gormley, Charlottetown, charged with vagrancy, was further remanded until July 17, at the request of Police.

## Fortune Backs Handicraft Plan

Tourist Development Minister J. David Stewart said yesterday he was pleased with the size of Monday night's East Kings Resources Development group meeting in Fortune Bridge at which he outlined the province's proposed tourist handicraft industry.

About 78 persons attended and decided to back the plan.
