Lord Lovat, distinguished soldier and farmer is evidently keeping in touch with activities which may be described as rural, during his visit to Canada.

The Calgary Stampede is certainly not a city show and the gathering of the clans at Montague on Wednesday would, to a large extent, be composed of farm people.

By our standards, Lord Lovat's scale of farming is fantastic but no doubt the noble Lord will see much of interest in our small holdings, and be the first to admit that they constitute the real strength of the Nation, both in peace and war.

What Is At Stake?

Those who clamor for the unrestricted sale of vegetable oil products and those who consider it hopeless to oppose them should consider carefully what the long term results may be should the dairy industry be pushed into the background in Eastern Canada.

Eastern Canada is essentially a grass country. Grass is, and should continue to be, the basis of our husbandry in the eastern provinces. Grass, as pasture, silage or hay, must be paired with cattle. They are inseparable in a sound farming economy. If we replace dairy cattle with beef cattle we will quickly make two farms into one and erase half of the independent, enterprising freeholders as well as their investments.

And what will we do with the cattle?

Already, Canada has an annual surplus of 400,000 head. Perhaps we could double the surplus and still find a market for them, but the prospects are not good.

The alternative is cash crops and that in the end would be disastrous. Only a small percentage of the soils in Eastern Canada is strong enough to produce intertilled crops for any length of time without losing its fertility by exhaustion and erosion.

From the viewpoint of land use, conservation and soil maintenance anything that harms the dairy industry also impairs agriculture and the economy of the nation.
