**New Norway ambassador has link with Canada**

OSLO (Reuters) — Norway's couple used to spend vacations at Bell's summer house in Cape Breton. The 87-year-old Oftedal, who succeeds H. E. Bredo Stabell, is a 30-year veteran of the diplomatic service, a career he chose over engineering.

Torfinn Oftedal, who leaves for Ottawa June 23, is married to the great-granddaughter of Alexander Graham Bell and the

It was while he was a student at Trondheim Technical University that he became interested in international affairs. He recalls spending long hours in heated debates on foreign policy with socialist students, including O. C. Gundersen, who later became minister of justice, at meetings of the student association.

Oftedal, a life-long Liberal, was elected the association's chairman after first being defeated by Gundersen.

"I have never regretted that decision back in 1936," he says of his choice of a diplomatic career. "The years have been interesting and now I have the position I've always wanted."

**WORKED IN WASHINGTON**

Oftedal's first tour of duty abroad was as secretary to the Norwegian embassy in Washington from 1938 to 1946. It was during those years that he made his first contact with Canada. In 1942 he married Gloria Grosvenor, who besides being great-granddaughter of the inventor is a daughter of the late Gilbert S. Grosvenor, president of National Geographic magazine. They have two children, a daughter 19 and a son 17. "I think I can say that I know Canada and Canadians

pretty well, both from my experiences as a holiday-maker and in an official capacity on many occasions," Oftedal says. "I often think of our debt to Canada for receiving and training so many Norwegian fighter pilots at Camp Little Norway during the last war."

Oftedal says Canada's prestige is high in Norway, there are no problems in bilateral relations, and the two nations share an almost identical way of life.

His first task as ambassador will be to prepare for Expo 67, the Montreal world's fair in which Norway, Sweden and Denmark will be represented by a joint pavilion.

**Economics is theme in Manitoba election**

WINNIPEG (CP)—Economic growth is the underlying campaign theme in Thursday's Manitoba election, with sharp disagreement whether the province is Western Canada's poor sister or its glass-slipped Cinderella.

Premier Duff Roblin, whose Progressive Conservative government has been in power for eight years and held 36 of 57 seats at dissolution, predicts Manitoba's industrial investment will climb 44 per cent this year—double the national average.

"People don't invest in a place that is going downhill where there is no opportunity

and a lack of constructive suggestions.

He has developed a 78-point election platform. It has been criticized by New Democratic Leader Russ Paulley as a reiteration of previously announced programs.

Mr. Paulley, a moderate socialist active in the CCF and NDP since 1952, advocates paying for services by property taxes and property taxes to people with general revenue.

Mr. Roblin has announced that he'll hold a special session of the legislature, if he is re-elected, to discuss revision in a school tax rebate program, medical care and changes in tax on gasoline used in farm trucks.

Liberals long have advocated allowing farmers to use tax-free gasoline in farm trucks. Mr. Molgat proposes tax-free

gas for farm trucks plus a water and sewage assistance program for farms.

Both Liberals and New Democrats have scored the government for failing to help farmers cope with higher cost of production. The New Democrats propose price guarantees and a two-price system for wheat.

**DODGED TAXES, FINED**

TORONTO (CP)—Six former executives of a Toronto company have been fined a total of \$8,745 on charges of income tax evasion. The largest fine, \$4,050, was imposed Friday on Roy L. Calhoun, former president and managing director of Roscoe Metal Products, Ltd. All six have paid the back taxes and the interest on it, the court was told.

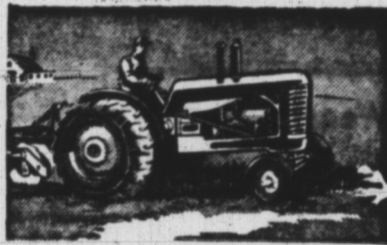
