I am sure that "Livin' On A Prayer" will not be the last hit for this group. Other songs on

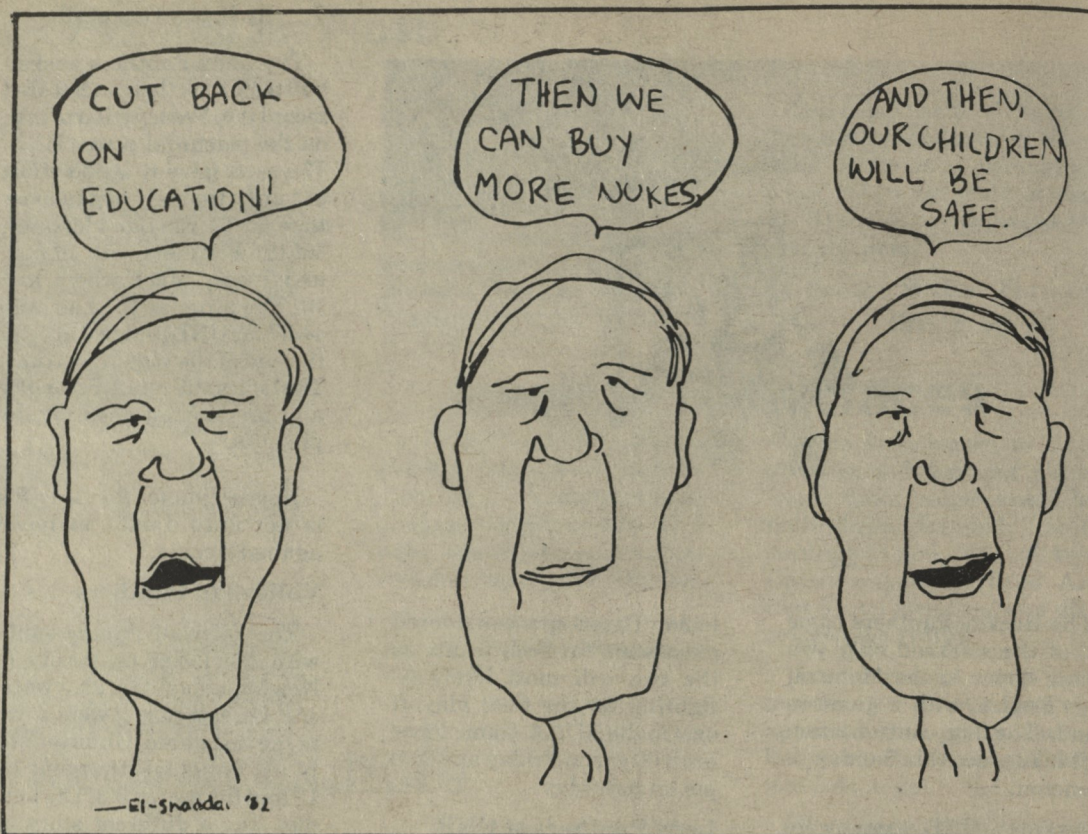
