

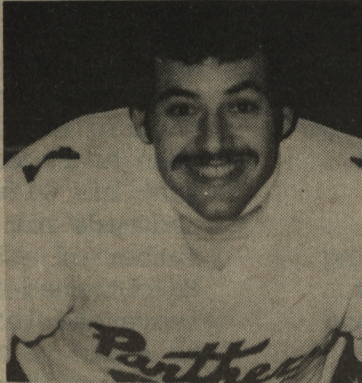
IT PARADE

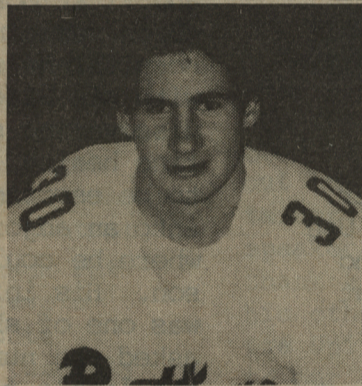

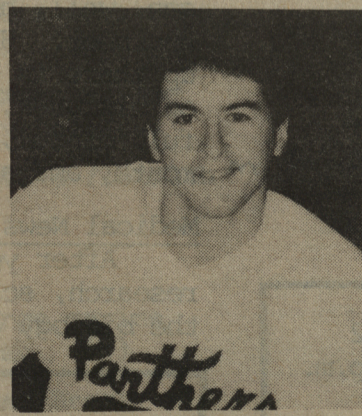

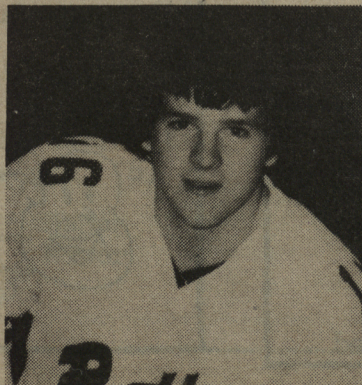
