

—Samples of wheat, peas and oats of a very fine general average have been received at the Department of Agriculture from the Lake Temiscamingue district in latitude 47° 30' North on the border of Ontario and Quebec.

—The Mail and Empire remarks that the British are calling for a free ballot in the Transvaal, and by a similar coincidence their sons are demanding an honest ballot in Ontario. Oom Paul is not clever as a politician. If he were he would concede the ballot, and then have the ballot-boxes stuffed.

—When by reason of large importations there is a large revenue the Conservatives reduced the rates—as, for example, when Mr. Foster took the duties off sugar and Sir Leonard Tilley took the duties from tea and coffee. But in like circumstances, under the Liberals there is no relief for the people, but, on the contrary, as the Mail and Empire remarks, a search for useless schemes upon which to spend money to the enrichment to useful partisans.

—An interesting experiment in license reform is about to be tested near Hazelmere, England. The District Refreshment Association, of which Sir Frederick Pollock is President, has built an inn at Grayshot and laid out some \$2,000 upon the premises. The idea is to conduct the place on lines which are a mild adaptation of the Gothenburg system. The Bishop of Winchester has announced his approval of the project, and last week, at the formal opening of the house, many notable persons were present.

Boers Maltreat Refugees

LONDON, October 5.—According to a despatch from Lorenzo Marques, Portuguese East Africa, a crowd of Boers who were assembled at the Machadorp station forced the refugee passengers to uncover during the singing of a Boer national air, and severely maltreated several Englishmen, stabbing one and kicking and trampling upon others. It is reported there also that two ladies have been outrageously assaulted at Paardekop station by the Boers, one being struck in the face by a rifle shoved through the railway carriage window and the other struck by her assailant's fists.
