NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market settled irregularly lower Friday on the lightest trading in nearly four weeks.

Volume was 4,170,000 shares compared with 5,000,000 Thursday and was the smallest since July 26 when 3,770,000 shares changed hands.

The Dow Jones industrial average took a small loss of 1.87 at 889.92.

Steels came to life late in the day. Jones and Laughlin rose 1 1/2 U.S. Steel 1/2, Republic 1/2, Bethlehem 1/4 and Lukens 3/8.

At the same time, the auto stocks eliminated most of their early losses. Chrysler made an especially strong showing, rising 1/2 to 47 1/2 as third most active stock.

The most active stock for the second straight session was Fairchild Camera, which rose 1/2 to 68 1/2 on 195,900 shares, recovering some of the 2 1/2 lost in the previous session.

KLM SHOOT'S UP—KLM Airlines spurred 6 points to 55 1/2 as second most active issue on 98,400 shares.

Pan American Sulphur, down 1/2 at 16 1/2, was another heavily-traded issue. Du Pont and Union Carbide each were down 1/4.
