

ONLY PARTIALLY RIGHT

East-West in today's deal felt that they had been the victims of a wildly optimistic opponent, blessed with a lot of luck, but this conclusion was not quite correct.

North dealer.


North-South were using "weak two-bids," with only a two-club opening as an artificial game force. (This system has gained some favor throughout the country.)

South's two-diamond response was also artificial, announcing less than 1 1/2 honor-tricks. On the next round the partners started to show their real suits, and then North taking the bull by the horns, leaped all the way to the slam in spades. This leap was (as East-West characterized it) an optimistic venture, despite North's tremendous high-card strength but it certainly turned out all right.

West was extremely unfortunate in his selection of the opening lead. A trump or a club opening would have given declarer a problem that could not be solved, since he would have had to use his only entry, the club king, for either a heart lead or a diamond lead toward dummy, and he obviously could not do both! Actually, however, West led a diamond, and this gave South the chance for an immediate finesse.

After the diamond jack held South cashed three trumps, then cashed the other diamond and the club ace. Now he led the club to his king and returned a heart. When West played the eight, declarer simply covered it with dummy's nine, and East was "hooked." Any return would give South the contract.

It is true that South had to be pretty lucky in finding the cards so well placed—but if West had put up the heart queen when South led that suit toward dummy, all the luck in the world would not have saved North-South!


