THE SEVEN PROVINCES.

British Columbia is the largest of the provinces and embraces an area of 382,000 square miles.
Prince Edward Island is the smallest—2,900 square miles.
The smallest of the seven is the most densely populated, having a little over 54 people to the square mile, while the largest is the most sparsely populated, with a little over three square miles to each person.
There is coal in four out of the seven provinces, Nova Scotia being the greatest producer with an output of about two and a quarter million tons per annum.
British Columbia is the greatest gold producer, the produce of her mines for thirty years having been valued at forty six and a half million dollars.
Nova Scotia has the most valuable fisheries, her annual catch averaging about seven million dollars in value.
Quebec takes the lead in the supply of timber, her output of saw logs amounting to 5,000,000,000 feet board measure, and of square timber to three and a quarter million cubic feet.
Ontario is the lumber cheese province, the production running up to about eight million dollars.
Combined, the whole seven have resources unequalled by those of any country in the world.

THEY DON'T AGREE.

WASHINGTON, July 20.—At Indian Head to-day another 18-inch Bethlehem Harveized armor-plate was fired, the test several weeks ago of a similar big plate having resulted in smashing the plate and creating a sensation. To-day's immense plate passed practically the same tests satisfactorily, though the plate was cracked several places.
LONDON, July 20.—It has been arranged that a division on the evicted tenants' bill will be taken on Monday next in the House of Commons.
NEW LONDON, Conn., July 20.—Southern Connecticut is experiencing the severest drought of any year recorded by the New London weather bureau. There has been no rain of value to the crops since May 27. Many of the crops are less than half an inch, and this month to date not over a quarter of an inch has fallen. All crops are withering away. The grass is burned brown and no amount of water will revive it. The potato crop will hardly pay for the digging. The hay crop just harvested amounts to 75 per cent. of the average.
Vegetable growers in the towns about New Haven have a similar hope of realizing half the money expended. Pasturage is scarce, and wells are going dry.
