"At no previous period" said the Archbishop in his address at the recent Aquith wedding "have the English people cared so much as they do now about the home life of their public men. We may go further and assert that the people everywhere are yearly demanding a higher record of useful and honorable living for their public men. It is hardly sufficient now that a public man should be only and negatively moral in his home life. He must also show himself strong and active in good service for his fellow men. "Fear by year we are going into fuller recognition of the truth that is, 'The men most man, work best for men.'"
